1	FOR AN ACT relating to revenue and taxation; to amend section
2	77-3504, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2008;
3	to redefine household income for homestead exemption
4	purposes; to provide an operative date; and to repeal the
5	original section.

6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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Section 1. Section 77-3504, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:

3 77-3504 Household income means the total federal adjusted gross income, as defined in the Internal Revenue Code, plus (1) any 4 5 Nebraska adjustments increasing the total federal adjusted gross 6 income $\tau$  and (2) any interest or dividends received by the owner 7 regarding obligations of the State of Nebraska or any political 8 subdivision, authority, commission, or instrumentality thereof to 9 the extent excluded in the computation of gross income for federal 10 income tax purposes, and (3) any social security or railroad 11 retirement benefit to the extent excluded in the computation of 12 gross income for federal income tax purposes, of the claimant 13 and spouse, and any additional owners who are natural persons and who occupy the homestead, for the taxable year of the claimant 14 15 immediately prior to the year for which the claim for exemption 16 is made, less all medical expenses actually incurred and paid by 17 the claimant, his or her spouse, or any owner-occupant which are 18 in excess of four percent of household income calculated prior to 19 the deduction for medical expenses. For purposes of this section, 20 medical expenses means the costs of health insurance premiums and 21 the costs of goods and services purchased from a person licensed 22 under the Uniform Credentialing Act or a health care facility 23 or health care service licensed under the Health Care Facility 24 Licensure Act for purposes of restoring or maintaining health, 25 including insulin and prescription medicine, but not including

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1 nonprescription medicine.
