A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to the Enhanced Wireless 911 Services Act; to
2	amend sections 86-442, 86-443, 86-461, 86-462, 86-464,
3	86-465, and 86-466, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska;
4	to change the membership and duties of the Enhanced
5	Wireless 911 Advisory Board; to change provisions
6	relating to service agreements and compensation of costs;
7	to change duties of the Public Service Commission; to
8	define terms; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the
9	original sections.

10 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 86-442, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 86-442 Sections 86-442 to 86-470 and sections 3 to 7 of
- 4 this act shall be known and may be cited as the Enhanced Wireless
- 5 911 Services Act.
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 86-443, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 7 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 8 86-443 For purposes of the Enhanced Wireless 911 Services
- 9 Act, the definitions found in sections 86-444 to 86-456.01 and
- 10 sections 3 to 7 of this act apply.
- 11 Sec. 3. Phase I E-911 service means a telephone
- 12 exchange communications service with a wireless automatic location
- 13 identification feature by which information is provided to a public
- 14 safety answering point identifying the telephone number of the
- 15 originator of a wireless 911 call and the location of the cellular
- 16 <u>site or base station transmitting the call.</u>
- 17 Sec. 4. Phase II E-911 service means a telephone
- 18 exchange communications service with a wireless automatic location
- 19 identification feature by which information is provided to a public
- 20 safety answering point identifying the information provided by
- 21 Phase I E-911 service and the latitude and longitude of the caller.
- 22 Sec. 5. Tier I wireless carrier means a wireless carrier
- 23 that has more than two and one-half million subscribers.
- 24 Sec. 6. <u>Tier II wireless carrier means a wireless carrier</u>
- 25 that has five hundred thousand or more and less than or equal to

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- 1 two and one-half million subscribers.
- 2 Sec. 7. Tier III wireless carrier means a wireless
- 3 carrier that has at least one subscriber but less than five hundred
- 4 thousand subscribers.
- 5 Sec. 8. Section 86-461, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 6 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 7 86-461 (1) The Enhanced Wireless 911 Advisory Board is
- 8 created to advise the commission concerning the implementation,
- 9 development, administration, coordination, evaluation, and
- 10 maintenance of enhanced wireless 911 service. The advisory board
- 11 shall be composed of nine the following individuals appointed by
- 12 the Governor: 7 including:
- 13 (a) One sheriff;
- 14 (b) (a) Two county officials or employees, one of whom is
- 15 a sheriff;
- 16 (e) (b) Two municipal officials or employees, at least
- one of whom represents a city of the first or second class;
- 18 (d) One representative (c) Two representatives from the
- 19 state's wireless telecommunications industry, one of whom is a
- 20 representative of a Tier I or Tier II wireless carrier and one of
- 21 whom is a representative of a Tier III wireless carrier;
- 22 (e) (d) One manager of a public safety answering point
- 23 not employed by a sheriff;
- 24 (f) (e) One representative of the state's local exchange
- 25 telecommunications service industry; from a provider of basic local

1 exchange service that directly provides E-911 service through a

- 2 selective router; and
- 3 (g) (f) One member of the public. representative from a
- 4 vendor that provides E-911 related services, the costs of which are
- 5 eligible for funding pursuant to section 86-465, who shall serve as
- 6 a technical advisor.
- 7 (2) The advisory board shall also include two ex officio
- 8 members:
- 9 (a) One commissioner from the Public Service Commission
- 10 or his or her designee; and
- 11 (b) The Chief Information Officer or his or her designee.
- 12 (3) Members Beginning on the effective date of this act,
- 13 members of the board as described in subdivisions (1)(a) through
- 14 $\frac{(1)}{(g)}$ (1) (d) of this section shall be appointed for a term
- 15 of three two years and shall only serve for one term before a
- 16 successor is appointed. Each succeeding member The other members
- 17 of the board shall be appointed for a term of three years. of two
- 18 years and may serve no more than three successive two-year terms.
- 19 The board shall meet as often as necessary to carry out its duties.
- 20 Members of the board shall be reimbursed for their actual and
- 21 necessary expenses as provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177.
- 22 Sec. 9. Section 86-462, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 23 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 24 86-462 (1) The advisory board shall make recommendations
- 25 to the commission regarding the implementation of the Enhanced

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- 1 Wireless 911 Services Act, including:
- 2 (a) The allocation of funds from the Enhanced Wireless
- 3 911 Fund as specified in section 86-465;
- 4 (b) (a) Rules and regulations necessary to carry out the
- 5 act;
- 6 (c) (b) Any adjustments in the surcharge amount to
- 7 recommend to the Legislature; and
- 8 (d) (c) The resolution of any disputes between public
- 9 safety answering points and wireless carriers.
- 10 (2) The commission may approve and implement any
- 11 recommendations of the advisory board.
- 12 Sec. 10. Section 86-464, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 13 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 14 86-464 A public safety answering point may enter into
- 15 a service agreement with one or more wireless carriers. The
- 16 commission shall determine the most efficient method administrative
- 17 and organizational methods for providing enhanced wireless 911
- 18 service. Such methods shall be competitively and technologically
- 19 neutral.
- 20 Sec. 11. Section 86-465, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 21 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 22 86-465 (1) The commission shall, in consultation with the
- 23 advisory board:
- 24 (a) Determine the costs <u>necessary</u> to implement wireless
- 25 automatic location identification; and maintain both Phase I and

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(b) Determine the level of funding needed to trigger 2 3 disbursements pursuant to the Enhanced Wireless 911 Services Act; (c) (b) Determine the percentage of the fund to be 4 5 allocated to each funding purpose, including the percentage that 6 shall be designated for funding 911 service under subdivision (2)(e) of this section; established under subsection (2) of this 7 section; 9 (d) (c) Determine how the funds distributed under 10 subdivisions (2)(a) and $\frac{(2)(e)}{(2)}$ (2)(b) of this section are to be 11 allocated in a competitively and technologically neutral manner 12 among the wireless carriers and the public safety answering points. 13 The commission shall allocate at least fifty percent of the total 14 amount of the funding available to wireless carriers to recover 15 their eligible costs unless during the calendar quarter during which such eligible costs were submitted the total of all such 16 17 eligible costs submitted for funding by all wireless carriers 18 seeking funding is less than fifty percent of the available funding 19 from the fund for all eligible purposes established in subsection 20 (2) of this section; and 21 (e) (d) Establish a competitively and technologically 22 neutral mechanism for determining the level of funding available to 23 each public safety answering point and wireless carrier for costs 24 determined to be eligible by the commission under subsection (2) of 25 this section. Such mechanism shall credit the following against the

- 1 eligible costs submitted for funding:
- 2 (i) For public safety answering points, all amounts
- 3 collected from wireless carriers or subscribers of wireless
- 4 carriers through occupation taxes and other taxes used for the
- 5 purpose of paying, directly or indirectly, the eligible costs of
- 6 public safety answering points to implement and maintain enhanced
- 7 wireless 911 service; and
- 8 (ii) For wireless carriers, all amounts collected through
- 9 surcharges from the subscribers of such wireless carriers, other
- 10 than the surcharge established pursuant to section 86-457, for the
- 11 payment of eligible costs for implementing and maintaining enhanced
- 12 wireless 911 service.
- 13 (2) The commission shall, in consultation with the
- 14 advisory board, establish eligibility standards and criteria
- 15 for fund disbursement applications and standards and criteria
- 16 concerning the level of fund disbursement for each application.
- 17 In establishing such criteria and standards, the following $\underline{\text{The}}$
- 18 purposes for which funding may be eligible for funding: include,
- 19 but are not limited to, the following:
- 20 (a) Costs incurred or to be incurred by wireless carriers
- 21 to implement and maintain enhanced wireless 911 service pursuant
- 22 to a service agreement with a public safety answering point
- 23 or pursuant to a request for service from a public safety
- 24 answering point. Such costs may include, but not be limited
- 25 to, the portion of the costs for new equipment used for providing

1 enhanced wireless 911 service, costs to lease another vendor's

- 2 equipment or services to provide enhanced wireless 911 service,
- 3 costs to create or maintain any data base or data base elements
- 4 used solely for enhanced wireless 911 service, and other costs
- 5 of establishing enhanced wireless 911 service. The portion of the
- 6 costs of equipment or services used in the wireless carrier's main
- 7 infrastructure resulting in revenue to the wireless carrier is not
- 8 eligible for funding; and
- 9 (b) Costs incurred or to be incurred by public safety
- 10 answering points to implement and maintain enhanced wireless 911
- 11 service may include, including, but not be limited to, purchases
- 12 of new equipment, costs of upgrades, modification and personnel
- 13 training used solely to process the data elements of enhanced
- 14 wireless 911 service, and maintenance costs and license fees for
- 15 new equipment, and the purchase, installation, maintenance, and
- 16 operation of telecommunications equipment and telecommunications
- 17 services required for the provision of enhanced wireless 911
- 18 service. +
- 19 (c) Costs incurred or to be incurred by public safety
- 20 answering points for the purchase, installation, maintenance, and
- 21 operation of telecommunications equipment and telecommunications
- 22 services required for the provision of enhanced wireless 911
- 23 service; and
- 24 (d) Expenses incurred by members of the advisory board
- 25 while performing duties required by the act.

1 (3) A wireless carrier receiving funds from the Enhanced

- 2 Wireless 911 Fund shall not directly assess any of the costs
- 3 associated with the implementation or provision of enhanced
- 4 wireless 911 service to any public safety answering point, county,
- 5 or municipality without the express consent of the commission.
- 6 (4) The commission shall have any powers necessary to
- 7 carry out the intent and purposes of the act. Enhanced Wireless 911
- 8 Services Act.
- 9 Sec. 12. Section 86-466, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 10 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 11 86-466 (1) A public safety answering point and wireless
- 12 carrier may be compensated for costs determined by the commission
- 13 to be eligible for funding. The level of funding available
- 14 to each public safety answering point and wireless carrier for
- 15 eligible cost compensation may be limited based upon the mechanism
- 16 established by the commission pursuant to section 86-465. The
- 17 commission is not required to provide compensation for costs to
- 18 more than one public safety answering point in any county. A
- 19 public safety answering point or wireless carrier may apply for
- 20 disbursement from the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund by submitting a
- 21 written application to the commission. The commission shall receive
- 22 and review applications, including supporting documentation. The
- 23 commission shall notify each applicant as to the commission's
- 24 approval or disapproval of the application.
- 25 (2) The commission is not required to provide

1 compensation for costs to more than one public safety answering

- 2 point in any county.
- 3 (2) Each entity that receives disbursements from the
- 4 fund shall make a full accounting of the money in a manner and form
- 5 prescribed by the commission.

- 7 86-462, 86-464, 86-465, and 86-466, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 8 Nebraska, are repealed.
