Section 1. Section 60-6,232, Revised Statutes Cumulative
 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:

3 60-6,232 A rotating or flashing amber light or lights
4 shall be displayed on the roof, front, or rear of any motor vehicle
5 being operated by any rural mail carrier outside the corporate
6 limits of any municipality in this state on or near any highway in
7 the process of delivering mail.

8 A rotating or flashing amber light or lights may be 9 displayed on (1) any vehicle of the Military Department while on 10 any state emergency mission, (2) any motor vehicle being operated 11 by any public utility, vehicle service, or towing service or any 12 publicly or privately owned construction or maintenance vehicle 13 while performing its duties on or near any highway, (3) any motor vehicle being operated by any member of the Civil Air Patrol, 14 15 (4) any pilot vehicle escorting an overdimensional load, (5) any 16 vehicle while actually engaged in the moving of houses, buildings, or other objects of extraordinary bulk, including unbaled livestock 17 18 forage as authorized by subdivision (2)(f) of section 60-6,288, Θ 19 (6) any motor vehicle owned by or operated on behalf of a railroad 20 carrier that is stopped to load or unload passengers, or (7) any 21 motor vehicle being operated by or on behalf of a weather spotter, 22 a person who holds an unrevoked and unexpired amateur radio station 23 license issued by the Federal Communications Commission, or an 24 emergency management worker as defined in section 81-829.39, while 25 such weather spotter, person, or worker is engaged in responding to
