A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to the Building Construction Act; to amend sections 71-6403, 71-6404, 71-6405, and 71-6406, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change the state building code; to change restrictions on political subdivisions; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 71-6403, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 71-6403 (1) There is hereby created the state building
- 4 code. The Legislature hereby adopts by reference:
- 5 (a) The International Building Code (IBC), 2000 edition,
- 6 published by the International Code Council;
- 7 (b) The International Residential Code (IRC), 2000
- 8 edition, published by the International Code Council; and
- 9 (c) The Uniform Code for Building Conservation.
- 10 International Existing Building Code, 2009 Edition, published by
- 11 the International Code Council.
- 12 (2) The codes adopted by reference in subsection (1) of
- 13 this section shall constitute the state building code except as
- 14 amended pursuant to the Building Construction Act or as otherwise
- 15 authorized by state law.
- 16 (3) Whenever a new edition of the codes adopted in
- 17 subsection (1) of this section is published, such new edition shall
- 18 be considered the state building code.
- 19 (4) The state building code shall be used in coordination
- 20 with and subject to the Life Safety Code and the powers and duties
- of the State Fire Marshal under section 81-502.
- Sec. 2. Section 71-6404, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 23 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 24 71-6404 The state building code shall be the building and
- 25 construction standard within the state and shall be applicable:

1 (1) To all buildings and structures owned by the state or

- 2 any state agency; and
- 3 (2) In each political subdivision which elects to adopt
- 4 the state building code or any component or combination of
- 5 components of the state building code.
- 6 Sec. 3. Section 71-6405, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 7 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 8 71-6405 All state agencies, including all state
- 9 constitutional offices, state administrative departments, and
- 10 state boards and commissions, the University of Nebraska, and the
- 11 Nebraska state colleges, shall comply with the state building
- 12 code. No state agency may adopt, promulgate, or enforce any rule
- 13 or regulation in conflict with the state building code unless
- 14 otherwise specifically authorized by statute to adopt or enforce a
- 15 building or construction code other than the state building code.
- 16 Nothing in the Building Construction Act shall authorize any state
- 17 agency to apply such act to manufactured homes or recreational
- 18 vehicles regulated by the Uniform Standard Code for Manufactured
- 19 Homes and Recreational Vehicles or to modular housing units
- 20 regulated by the Nebraska Uniform Standards for Modular Housing
- 21 Units Act. A state agency may, by rule or regulation, amend the
- 22 state building code by adopting any supplement, new edition, or
- 23 appendix of the International Building Code (IBC), 2000 edition,
- 24 International Residential Code (IRC), 2000 edition, or the Uniform
- 25 Code for Building Conservation International Existing Building

1 Code, 2009 Edition, referred to in section 71-6403, except that

- 2 all amendments shall be approved in advance by the Director of
- 3 Administrative Services. Amendments to the state building code may
- 4 also include variations from the code which will reduce unnecessary
- 5 costs of construction, increase safety, durability, or efficiency,
- 6 or address special local conditions within the state.
- 7 Sec. 4. Section 71-6406, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 8 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 9 71-6406 (1) Any political subdivision may enact,
- 10 administer, or enforce a local building or construction code if or
- 11 as long as such political subdivision adopts the state building
- 12 code. The political subdivision shall regularly update its code.
- 13 For purposes of this section, a code shall be deemed to be
- 14 regularly updated if the most recent edition is adopted by the
- 15 political subdivision within two years after the publication date
- 16 of the edition. No political subdivision may adopt or enforce a
- 17 local building or construction code other than as provided by this
- 18 section.
- 19 (2) A political subdivision may amend its local building
- 20 or construction code if the amendment:
- 21 (a) Conforms generally with the state building code;
- 22 (b) Adopts a special or differing building standard
- 23 to reduce unnecessary costs of construction, increase safety,
- 24 durability, or efficiency, or address special local conditions
- 25 within its jurisdiction; or

1 (c) Adopts any supplement, new edition, or appendix, or

- 2 component or combination of components of the state building code.
- 3 (3) A political subdivision may adopt and promulgate
- 4 amendments for the proper administration and enforcement of its
- 5 local building or construction code including organization of
- 6 enforcement, qualifications of staff members, examination of plans,
- 7 inspections, appeals, permits, and fees. Any amendment adopted
- 8 pursuant to this section shall be published separately from
- 9 the local building or construction code. Fees, if any, for
- 10 services which monitor a builder's application of codes shall
- 11 be negotiable between the political subdivisions involved, but such
- 12 fees shall not exceed the actual expenses incurred by the political
- 13 subdivision doing the monitoring.
- 14 (4) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Building
- 15 Construction Act, a public building of a political subdivision
- 16 shall be built in accordance with the applicable local building or
- 17 construction code.
- 18 Sec. 5. Original sections 71-6403, 71-6404, 71-6405, and
- 19 71-6406, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
