A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to protection orders; to amend section 42-924,
- 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to provide for
- 3 the care of and protect from harm domestic animals as
- 4 prescribed; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 42-924, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 42-924 (1) Any victim of domestic abuse may file a
- 4 petition and affidavit for a protection order as provided in
- 5 subsection (2) of this section. Upon the filing of such a petition
- 6 and affidavit in support thereof, the judge or court may issue a
- 7 protection order without bond granting the following relief:
- 8 (a) Enjoining the respondent from imposing any restraint
- 9 upon the petitioner or upon the liberty of the petitioner;
- 10 (b) Enjoining the respondent from threatening,
- 11 assaulting, molesting, attacking, or otherwise disturbing the peace
- 12 of the petitioner;
- 13 (c) Enjoining the respondent from telephoning,
- 14 contacting, or otherwise communicating with the petitioner;
- 15 (d) Removing and excluding the respondent from the
- 16 residence of the petitioner, regardless of the ownership of the
- 17 residence;
- 18 (e) Ordering the respondent to stay away from any place
- 19 specified by the court;
- 20 (f) Awarding the petitioner temporary custody of any
- 21 minor children not to exceed ninety days; or
- 22 (g) Directing the care, custody, or control of any
- 23 domestic animal owned, possessed, leased, kept, or held by either
- 24 party or a minor child residing in the household;
- 25 (h) Enjoining the respondent from harming or killing,

1 without justification, any domestic animal owned, possessed,

- 2 leased, kept, or held by the petitioner or a minor child residing
- 3 in the household; or
- 4 (g) (i) Ordering such other relief deemed necessary to
- 5 provide for the safety and welfare of the petitioner and any
- 6 designated family or household member.
- 7 (2) Petitions for protection orders shall be filed with
- 8 the clerk of the district court, and the proceeding may be heard
- 9 by the county court or the district court as provided in section
- 10 25-2740.
- 11 (3) A petition filed pursuant to subsection (1) of this
- 12 section may not be withdrawn except upon order of the court. An
- 13 order issued pursuant to subsection (1) of this section shall
- 14 specify that it is effective for a period of one year and, if
- 15 the order grants temporary custody, the number of days of custody
- 16 granted to the petitioner unless otherwise modified by the court.
- 17 Any person who knowingly violates an order issued pursuant to
- 18 subsection (1) of this section or section 42-931 after service
- 19 shall be guilty of a Class II misdemeanor, except that (a) any
- 20 person convicted of violating such order who has a prior conviction
- 21 for violating a protection order shall be guilty of a Class I
- 22 misdemeanor and (b) any person convicted of violating such order
- 23 who has a prior conviction for violating the same protection order
- 24 or a protection order granted to the same petitioner shall be
- 25 guilty of a Class IV felony.

1 (4) If there is any conflict between sections 42-924 to

- 2 42-926 and any other provision of law, sections 42-924 to 42-926
- 3 shall govern.
