- FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to amend Laws 2009, LB 313, section 17; Laws 2009, LB 315, section 76; Laws 2009, First Special Session, LB 1, sections 15, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21, 22, 23, 27, 41, 87, 98, 104, 210, and 228; to define terms; to appropriate funds; to change certain appropriations; to provide for transfers; to repeal the original sections; and to declare an emergency.
- Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.
- 2 For purposes of this act and any other legislative

- 4 which appropriates funds, FY2008-09 means the period July 1, 2008,
- 5 through June 30, 2009; FY2009-10 means the period July 1, 2009,
- 6 through June 30, 2010; FY2010-11 means the period July 1, 2010,
- 7 through June 30, 2011; FY2011-12 means the period July 1, 2011,
- 8 through June 30, 2012; and FY2012-13 means the period July 1, 2012,
- 9 through June 30, 2013.
