

One Hundred First Legislature - First Session - 2009 Introducer's Statement of Intent LB 652

The following constitutes the reasons for this bill and the purposes which are sought to be accomplished thereby:

Legislative Bill 652 amends the Enhanced wireless 911 Services Act ("Act") in order to provide direction to the Public Service Commission (PSC) in its statutory duty to establish a mechanism for determining the percentage of the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund (E-911 Fund) to be allocated to wireless carriers and PSAPs for recovery of eligible costs for implementing and maintaining enhanced wireless E-911 services. LB 652 accomplishes these objectives as follows:

- 1. Clarifies language establishing the duties of the PSC in determining how the money in the E-911 Fund will be allocated and used
- 2. Requires the PSC to allocate at least 50% of the E-911 Fund for recovery of eligible cost incurred by wireless carriers to implement and maintain enhanced wireless E-911 services, unless requests for funding are less than 50% of the E-911 Fund
- 3. Requires such mechanism to be technically and competitively neutral
- 4. Requires the PSC to credit against eligible costs sought for recovery from the E-911 Fund revenues obtained from other sources for payment of those eligible costs (i.e., occupation taxes, other taxes, or other surcharges on wireless carrier subscribers of wireless carriers, etc.)
- 5. Defines the terms "Phase I E-911 Services" and "Phase II E-911 Services" so that the PSC is required to allocate funding to both phases of enhanced wireless E-911 services
- 6. Defines Tier I, II, and III Wireless Carriers so that the different interests of such carriers can be represented on the Enhanced Wireless 911 Advisory Board (Advisory Board)
- 7. Expands the representation of wireless carriers on the Advisory Board to two representatives, one of whom shall be a representative of a Tier III wireless carrier
- 8. Requires on member of the Advisory Board to have actual professional expertise in the delivery of enhanced E-911 wireless services
- 9. Requires the local exchange carrier representatives on the Advisory Board to represent a company which actually provides E-911 services through a selective router
- 10. Requires at least one municipal official or employee to represent a city of the first or second class
- 11. Removes from the duties of the Advisory Board the task of making recommendations to the PSC concerning the allocation of funs from the E-911 Fund
