Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 164 requires notice to the local authority and electric utility of a vehicle moving an oversized object or building on a county or township road.

The bill requires a person moving a building/object over 15 feet, 6 inches high or wider than the road to notify the local authority and electric utility of the move.

Notification must be given 10 days in advance of the move, and should include a description of the vehicle, specifications of the object being moved, the route being used, and the date and time of the move.

The new section does not exempt the person from complying with any other notification or permit requirements for oversized vehicles found within the Rules of the Road.

Any violation of this section would be a Class III misdemeanor (max 3 months prison / \$500 fine or both).

Explanation of amendments:

The committee amendment, AM 286, clarifies that a building or object being moved, in combination with the transporting vehicle, can be no higher than 15 feet, 6 inches before notification is required.
