This bill creates the 26-member Nebraska Children's Commission. The commission would be comprised of representatives of the three branches of state government and members of the general public. The Health and Human Services Committee with assistance from the Department of Health and Human Services and the Nebraska Children's Commission is require to prepare legislation in the 2013 Session creating the Department of Children's Services. The Department of Children's Services would be responsible for all child welfare programs which include but are not limited to behavioral health, developmental disabilities, public health and Medicaid as those programs pertain to children. The Department of Children's Services would begin providing services July 1, 2013. The commission is also charged with developing a statewide strategic plan for reform of the system of child welfare programs and services. The Nebraska Children's Commission Fund is created. The bill states legislative intent to transfer funding from the Health Care Cash Fund to the Nebraska Children's Commission Fund. The Department of Health and Human Services is required to implement a process to obtain and utilize data analytics, business intelligence or similar information technology for accessing real-time data in order to foster better decision-making.

Members of the commission who are state employees will have their expenses paid from their respective agency budgets. The costs for travel expenses will be minimal and can be absorbed within the existing agencies' resources. The commission will have 18 members who are not state employees. The amount of travel costs will depend on the residences of those members and the number of meetings. The amount could range from \$1,000 to \$3,000 annually. The Children's Commission is charged with creating a statewide strategic plan for child welfare program and service reform. Existing staff resources will be used to accomplish this task. The commission would also contract with a national entity for a systemwide evaluation of the child welfare system. The Casey Foundation is currently working with the state and may assist with this evaluation. Casey offers services to states at no charge. If another entity does the evaluation, there may be a cost. An estimate is not available. All costs for the commission and it's work would be paid from the cash fund.

The creation of the Department of Children's Services will primarily be the transfer of staff and expenses from the Department of Health and Human Services to the new agency. Some administrative support functions may be difficult to separate in whole or in part. There could be additional staff that is needed to support the new agency. Additional analysis is needed to make this determination.

Aid programs would be moved in whole or partially. The net impact would be zero.

For the purposes of this fiscal note, it is assumed current office space and the office infrastructure could be configured to accommodate the Department of Children's Services.

The new agency is required to have an independent entity specializing in Medicaid analysis conduct a cross-system analysis of current funding and services. The entity shall identify areas where the state could better maximize general fund to increase federal funds and more effectively utilize current funding. The cost of the contract for this activity could range from \$200,000 to \$400,000. The cost would be split evenly between general and federal funds. The additional federal funding that may be generated is unknown.

The bill requires the Department of Health and Human Services to implement a process to obtain and utilize data analytics, business intelligence or similar information technology for accessing real-time data. A projected cost cannot be determined. An analysis would need to be conducted to determine if the current information can be modified or if a new system would be needed.

SUPREME COURT: LB 821 provides that it is the intent that commission expenses would be paid with funds appropriated from the Health Care Cash Fund.
