A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to the Board of Pardons; to amend section
2 83-1,130, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change
3 the number of years between appearances before the board
4 from two years to five years; and to repeal the original
5 section.
6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 83-1,130, Reissue Revised Statutes of
2 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 83-1,130 (1) After consideration of the application and
4 after such further investigations as it may deem appropriate, the
5 Board of Pardons shall either grant or deny the relief requested or
6 grant such other relief as may be justified. The board may decline to
7 accept further applications after the initial application for pardon
8 from an offender for any prescribed amount of time, but in no case
9 shall such time exceed ~~two~~five years. The board shall notify the
10 offender in writing of any restriction for subsequent applications
11 after the hearing on the initial application.

12 (2) The Board of Pardons may, in appropriate cases when a
13 person has been convicted of a felony and has been granted a pardon
14 by the appropriate authority of this state or is hereafter granted a
15 pardon for a conviction occurring prior to, on, or subsequent to
16 August 25, 1969, empower the Governor to expressly authorize such
17 person to receive, possess, or transport in commerce a firearm.

18 (3) All actions of the Board of Pardons shall be by
19 majority vote and shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of
20 State or the office designated by the Secretary of State.

21 Sec. 2. Original section 83-1,130, Reissue Revised
22 Statutes of Nebraska, is repealed.
