| 1 | FOR AN ACT relating to the Legislature; to amend sections 50-401.01, |
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| 2 | 50-1206, and 50-1304, Reissue Revised Statutes of |
| 3 | Nebraska, and section 71-465, Revised Statutes Cumulative |
| 4 | Supplement, 2010; to eliminate the office of Legislative |
| 5 | Research and the position of Director of Research; to |
| 6 | harmonize provisions; to repeal the original sections; |
| 7 | and to outright repeal section 50-416, Reissue Revised |
| 8 | Statutes of Nebraska. |
| 9 | Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska, |

1 Section 1. Section 50-401.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 50-401.01 (1) The Legislative Council shall have an
- 4 executive board, to be known as the Executive Board of the
- 5 Legislative Council, which shall consist of a chairperson, a vice-
- 6 chairperson, and six members of the Legislature, to be chosen by the
- 7 Legislature at the commencement of each regular session of the
- 8 Legislature when the speaker is chosen, and the Speaker of the
- 9 Legislature. The Legislature at large shall elect two of its members
- 10 from legislative districts Nos. 1, 2, 15, 21 to 30, 32, 34, and 46,
- 11 two from legislative districts Nos. 3 to 14, 18, 20, 31, 39, and 45,
- 12 and two from legislative districts Nos. 16, 17, 19, 33, 35 to 38, 40
- 13 to 44, and 47 to 49. The Chairperson of the Committee on
- 14 Appropriations shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio member of the
- 15 executive board whenever the board is considering fiscal
- 16 administration.
- 17 (2) The executive board shall:
- 18 (a) Supervise all services and service personnel of the
- 19 Legislature and may employ and fix compensation and other terms of
- 20 employment for such personnel as may be needed to carry out the
- 21 intent and activities of the Legislature or of the board, unless
- 22 otherwise directed by the Legislature, including the adoption of
- 23 policies by the executive board which permit (i) the purchasing of an
- 24 annuity for an employee who retires or (ii) the crediting of amounts
- 25 to an employee's deferred compensation account under section 84-1504.

1 The payments to or on behalf of an employee may be staggered to

- 2 comply with other law; and
- 3 (b) Appoint persons to fill the positions of Legislative
- 4 Fiscal Analyst, Director of Research, Revisor of Statutes, and
- 5 Legislative Auditor. The persons appointed to these positions shall
- 6 have training and experience as determined by the executive board and
- 7 shall serve at the pleasure of the executive board. The Legislative
- 8 Performance Audit Committee shall recommend the person to be
- 9 appointed Legislative Auditor. Their respective salaries shall be set
- 10 by the executive board.
- 11 (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
- 12 executive board may contract to obtain legal, auditing, accounting,
- 13 actuarial, or other professional services or advice for or on behalf
- 14 of the executive board, the Legislative Council, the Legislature, or
- 15 any member of the Legislature. The providers of such services or
- 16 advice shall meet or exceed the minimum professional standards or
- 17 requirements established or specified by their respective
- 18 professional organizations or licensing entities or by federal law.
- 19 Such contracts, the deliberations of the executive board with respect
- 20 to such contracts, and the work product resulting from such contracts
- 21 shall not be subject to review or approval by any other entity of
- 22 state government.
- Sec. 2. Section 50-1206, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 24 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 25 50-1206 (1) Requests for performance audits may be made

1 by the Governor, any other constitutional officer of the State of

- 2 Nebraska, a legislator, the Legislative Auditor, or the Legislative
- 3 Fiscal Analyst. , or the Director of Research of the Legislature.
- 4 (2) Performance audit requests shall be submitted to the
- 5 committee chairperson or Legislative Auditor by letter or on a form
- 6 developed by the Legislative Auditor.
- 7 (3) When considering a performance audit request, if the
- 8 committee determines that the request has potential merit but
- 9 insufficient information is available, it may, by majority vote,
- 10 instruct the Legislative Auditor to conduct a preaudit inquiry.
- 11 (4) Upon completion of the preaudit inquiry, the
- 12 committee chairperson shall place the request on the agenda for the
- 13 committee's next meeting and shall notify the request sponsor of that
- 14 action.
- 15 Sec. 3. Section 50-1304, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 16 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 17 50-1304 (1) All agencies, boards, commissions, and
- 18 departments of the state shall furnish such information, reports,
- 19 aid, services, and assistance as may be requested by any standing
- 20 committee of the Legislature in the performance of its duties.
- 21 (2) The Government, Military and Veterans Affairs
- 22 Committee of the Legislature shall use its staff and may also request
- 23 assistance from the Director of Research of the Legislature, the
- 24 Legislative Fiscal Analyst, or any other division within the
- 25 Legislature as may be necessary in the performance of the duties set

- 1 forth in sections 50-1301 to 50-1304.
- 2 Sec. 4. Section 71-465, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 3 Supplement, 2010, is amended to read:
- 4 71-465 (1) The Legislature finds that Nebraska's general
- 5 acute and critical access hospitals provide a foundation of health
- 6 care throughout the state. This long-established means of providing
- 7 health care is changing. Because health care delivery is evolving, it
- 8 is important to assess needs in Nebraska and determine whether
- 9 licensure and regulation should be changed to reflect current and
- 10 future practices.
- 11 (2) The department shall not accept an application for or
- 12 issue a license for a new hospital beginning on April 15, 2010, and
- 13 continuing through September 15, 2011, except that this prohibition
- 14 shall not apply to an application for or issuance of a license as a
- 15 critical access hospital or an application for or issuance of a
- 16 license for any hospital which has begun construction prior to May 1,
- 17 2010.
- 18 (3) The Health and Human Services Committee of the
- 19 Legislature shall study health care in Nebraska. The study shall
- 20 include, but not be limited to:
- 21 (a) A comparison of the roles of Nebraska's general acute
- 22 hospitals, critical access hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers,
- 23 and other limited service facilities, such as physician-owned
- 24 hospitals and investor-owned hospitals, and the impact of such
- 25 hospitals, centers, and facilities on access to services, quality of

1 health care, and cost, including medicaid costs and insurance

- 2 premiums;
- 3 (b) Compliance with the federal Emergency Medical
- 4 Treatment and Active Labor Act, 42 U.S.C. 1395dd, as such act existed
- 5 on January 1, 2010;
- 6 (c) Referral practices;
- 7 (d) Ownership disclosure;
- 8 (e) Uncompensated and under-compensated patient care;
- 9 (f) Joint ventures among or between hospitals,
- 10 physicians, and investors;
- 11 (g) Reinvestment in facilities;
- 12 (h) Examination and definition of community benefits;
- 13 (i) Clarification and definition of limited service
- 14 facilities, such as physician-owned hospitals and investor-owned
- 15 hospitals, and other definitions as needed; and
- 16 (j) The impact of federal health care reform on the items
- in subdivisions (a) through (i) of this subsection.
- 18 (4) The committee shall seek information from resources,
- 19 including, but not limited to, physicians; representatives of
- 20 hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, physician-owned hospitals,
- 21 investor-owned hospitals, public health agencies, the department, and
- 22 allied professions such as behavioral health service providers,
- 23 nurses, pharmacists, and emergency care providers; businesses;
- 24 consumers; insurers; communities; and the Legislative Fiscal
- 25 Analyst. ; and the office of Legislative Research.

1 (5) The committee shall report its findings to the

- 2 Legislature by December 31, 2010.
- 3 Sec. 5. Original sections 50-401.01, 50-1206, and
- 4 50-1304, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 71-465,
- 5 Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2010, are repealed.
- 6 Sec. 6. The following section is outright repealed:
- 7 Section 50-416, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska.
