A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to the Medical Assistance Act; to amend section
 68-909, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to provide
 duties for the Department of Health and Human Services;
 and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 68-909, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 68-909 (1) All contracts, agreements, rules, and
- 4 regulations relating to the medical assistance program as entered
- 5 into or adopted and promulgated by the department prior to July 1,
- 6 2006, and all provisions of the medicaid state plan and waivers
- 7 adopted by the department prior to July 1, 2006, shall remain in
- 8 effect until revised, amended, repealed, or nullified pursuant to
- 9 law.
- 10 (2) Prior to the adoption and promulgation of proposed
- 11 rules and regulations under section 68-912 or relating to the
- 12 implementation of medicaid state plan amendments or waivers, the
- 13 department shall provide a report to the Governor, the Legislature,
- 14 and the Medicaid Reform Council no later than December 1 before the
- 15 next regular session of the Legislature summarizing the purpose and
- 16 content of such proposed rules and regulations and the projected
- 17 impact of such proposed rules and regulations on recipients of
- 18 medical assistance and medical assistance expenditures.
- 19 (3) The Medicaid Reform Council, no later than thirty
- 20 days after the date of receipt of any report under subsection (2) of
- 21 this section, may conduct a public meeting to receive public comment
- 22 regarding such report. The council shall promptly provide any
- 23 comments and recommendations regarding such report in writing to the
- 24 department. Such comments and recommendations shall be advisory only
- 25 and shall not be binding on the department, but the department shall

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1 promptly provide a written response to such comments or

- 2 recommendations to the council.
- 3 (4) The department shall monitor and shall periodically,
- 4 as necessary, but no less than biennially, report to the Governor,
- 5 the Legislature, and the Medicaid Reform Council on the
- 6 implementation of rules and regulations, medicaid state plan
- 7 amendments, and waivers adopted under the Medical Assistance Act and
- 8 the effect of such rules and regulations, amendments, or waivers on
- 9 eligible recipients of medical assistance and medical assistance
- 10 expenditures.
- 11 (5) The department shall apply for and use to the maximum
- 12 <u>extent possible any and all amendments, options, and waivers</u>
- 13 <u>available to Nebraska under the medical assistance program and</u>
- 14 corresponding rules and regulations to ensure that Nebraska reduces
- 15 and maximizes expenditures from the General Fund. If the department
- 16 is required to choose between or among amendments, options, or
- 17 waivers, the department shall apply for the amendment, option, or
- 18 waiver that is projected to result in the greatest number of persons
- 19 becoming eligible for benefits under the program, the greatest amount
- 20 of federal funds coming to the state pursuant to the program, or
- 21 both.
