1 Section 1. Section 81-1255, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 81-1255 (1) The governing body of the county shall after
- 4 a public hearing adopt a resolution establishing a County Visitors
- 5 Promotion Fund and a visitors committee which shall serve as an
- 6 advisory committee to the county board in administering the proceeds
- 7 from the taxes provided to the county by the Nebraska Visitors
- 8 Development Act. The governing body of a county may also after a
- 9 public hearing adopt a resolution establishing a County Visitors
- 10 Improvement Fund. The proceeds of the County Visitors Promotion Fund
- 11 shall be used generally to promote, encourage, and attract visitors
- 12 to come to the county and use the travel and tourism facilities
- 13 within the county. The proceeds of the County Visitors Improvement
- 14 Fund shall be used to improve the visitor attractions and facilities
- in the county, except that no proceeds shall be used to improve a
- 16 facility in which parimutuel wagering is conducted. If the visitors
- 17 committee determines that the visitor attractions in the county are
- 18 adequate and do not require improvement, the committee may use the
- 19 County Visitors Improvement Fund to promote, encourage, and attract
- 20 visitors to the county to use the county's travel and tourism
- 21 facilities.
- 22 (2)(a) In determining how to use the proceeds of the
- 23 <u>County Visitors Promotion Fund and the County Visitors Improvement</u>
- 24 Fund, the governing body of the county and the visitors committee
- 25 <u>shall consider various factors, including, but not limited to:</u>

1	(i) The type of organization applying for funds and such
2	organization's resources;
3	(ii) The scope of the project;
4	(iii) The impact of the project;
5	(iv) The expected duration of the project;
6	(v) The number of applications received; and
7	(vi) If a grant is involved, the amount requested.
8	(b) The governing body of the county and the visitors
9	committee shall also ensure that projects funded under the Nebraska
10	<u>Visitors Development Act:</u>
11	(i) Increase attendance at an event, activity, or
12	attraction;
13	(ii) Increase stays at hotels or the use of travel and
14	tourism facilities in the county;
15	(iii) Promote a county as a destination by emphasizing
16	lodging, dining, shopping, and attractions; or
17	(iv) Promote and enhance tourism in the county.
18	(3)(a) The committee for any county containing a city of
19	the metropolitan class shall consist of the following seven members
20	appointed by the governing body of the county:
21	(i) Two members of the governing body of such county;
22	(ii) Two representatives of a metropolitan hospitality
23	association;
24	(iii) One representative of a convention and visitors
25	bureau;

1 (iv) One representative of the largest tourism attraction

- 2 in such county, as determined by the governing body of such county;
- 3 and
- 4 (v) One representative of a metropolitan entertainment
- 5 <u>and convention authority.</u>
- 6 (b) The committee for any county that does not contain a
- 7 city of the metropolitan class shall consist of five or seven members
- 8 appointed by the governing body of the county. If the committee has
- 9 five members, at least one but no more than two members of the
- 10 committee shall be in the hotel industry, and one member shall be
- 11 either a representative of a convention and visitors bureau or a
- 12 representative from a local chamber of commerce and industry. If the
- 13 committee has seven members, at least two but no more than three
- 14 members of the committee shall be in the hotel industry, one member
- 15 shall be a representative of a convention and visitors bureau, and
- 16 one member shall be a representative from a local chamber of commerce
- 17 and industry.
- 18 (c) Such appointees shall serve without compensation,
- 19 except for reimbursement for necessary expenses. Committee members
- 20 shall serve for terms of four years, except that at least half of
- 21 those appointed shall be appointed for initial terms of two years.
- 22 Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the initial
- 23 appointments. The committee shall elect a chairperson and vice-
- 24 chairperson from among its members to serve for terms of two years.
- 25 Sec. 2. Section 81-1258, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 1 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 2 81-1258 (1)(a) The County Visitors Improvement Fund shall
- 3 be administered by the governing body of the county with the advice
- 4 of the visitors committee created in section 81-1255. The fund shall
- 5 be used to make grants for expanding and improving facilities at any
- 6 existing visitor attraction, acquiring or expanding exhibits for
- 7 existing visitor attractions, constructing visitor attractions, or
- 8 planning or developing such expansions, improvements, or
- 9 construction.
- 10 (b) Grants shall be available for any visitor attraction
- 11 in the county owned by the public or any nonprofit organization, the
- 12 primary purpose of which is to operate the visitor attraction, except
- 13 that grants shall not be available for any visitor attraction where
- 14 parimutuel wagering is conducted. <u>In making grants under this</u>
- 15 section, the governing body of the county and the committee shall
- 16 consider the factors described in subsection (2) of section 81-1255.
- 17 (c) Grants may be made for a specified annual amount not
- 18 to exceed the proceeds derived from a sales tax rate of one percent
- 19 imposed by a county for a County Visitors Improvement Fund for a term
- 20 of years not to exceed twenty years and may be pledged by the
- 21 recipient to secure bonds issued to finance expansion, improvement,
- 22 or construction of a visitor attraction. Any grant made for a term of
- 23 years shall be funded each year in accordance with any agreement
- 24 contained in the grant contract.
- 25 (d) No bonds issued by a grant recipient which pledges

1 grant funds shall constitute a debt, liability, or general obligation

- 2 of the county levying the tax or a pledge of the faith and credit of
- 3 the county levying the tax but shall be payable solely from grant
- 4 funds. Each bond issued by any grant recipient which pledges grant
- 5 funds shall contain on the face thereof a statement that neither the
- 6 faith and credit nor the taxing power of the county levying the tax
- 7 is pledged to the payment of the principal of or the interest on such
- 8 bond.
- 9 (2) For purposes of this section and section 81-1255,
- 10 visitor attraction means a defined location open to the public, which
- 11 location is of educational, cultural, historical, artistic, or
- 12 recreational significance or provides entertainment or in which are
- 13 exhibits, displays, or performances of educational, cultural,
- 14 historic, artistic, or entertainment value.
