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1 Section 1. Section 9-812, Revised Statutes Supplement,

- 2 2011, is amended to read:
- 3 9-812 (1) All money received from the operation of
- 4 lottery games conducted pursuant to the State Lottery Act in Nebraska
- 5 shall be credited to the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund, which
- 6 fund is hereby created. All payments of the costs of establishing and
- 7 maintaining the lottery games shall be made from the State Lottery
- 8 Operation Cash Fund. In accordance with legislative appropriations,
- 9 money for payments for expenses of the division shall be transferred
- 10 from the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the State Lottery
- 11 Operation Cash Fund, which fund is hereby created. All money
- 12 necessary for the payment of lottery prizes shall be transferred from
- 13 the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the State Lottery Prize
- 14 Trust Fund, which fund is hereby created. The amount used for the
- 15 payment of lottery prizes shall not be less than forty percent of the
- 16 dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold.
- 17 (2) Beginning October 1, 2003, a portion of the dollar
- 18 amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized
- 19 basis shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust
- 20 Fund to the Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Opportunity Grant
- 21 Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair
- 22 Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund. The dollar amount
- 23 transferred pursuant to this subsection shall equal the greater of
- 24 (a) the dollar amount transferred to the funds in fiscal year 2002-03
- 25 or (b) any amount which constitutes at least twenty-two percent and

1 no more than twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery

- 2 tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis. To the extent
- 3 that funds are available, the Tax Commissioner and director may
- 4 authorize a transfer exceeding twenty-five percent of the dollar
- 5 amount of the lottery tickets sold on an annualized basis.
- 6 (3) Of the money available to be transferred to the
- 7 Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund, the
- 8 Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and
- 9 the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund:
- 10 (a) The first five hundred thousand dollars shall be
- 11 transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as
- 12 provided in section 71-817;
- 13 (b) Nineteen and three-fourths percent of the money
- 14 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the
- 15 initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be
- 16 transferred to the Education Innovation Fund;
- 17 (c) Twenty-four and three-fourths percent of the money
- 18 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the
- 19 initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be
- 20 transferred to the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund;
- 21 (d) Forty-four and one-half percent of the money
- 22 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the
- 23 initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be
- 24 transferred to the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund to be used as
- 25 provided in the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act;

(e) Ten percent of the money remaining after the payment

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2 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the 3 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska State Fair Board if the most populous city within the county 4 5 in which the fair is located provides matching funds equivalent to ten percent of the funds available for transfer. Such matching funds 6 7 may be obtained from the city and any other private or public entity, 8 except that no portion of such matching funds shall be provided by the state. If the Nebraska State Fair ceases operations, ten percent 9 of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating 10 expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers 11 12 Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the General Fund; and 13 (f) One percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the 14 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the 15 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in section 16 17 71-817. (4)(a) The Education Innovation Fund is created. At least 18 seventy-five percent of the lottery proceeds allocated to the 19 20 Education Innovation Fund shall be available for disbursement. (b) For fiscal year 2010-11, the Education Innovation 21 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first one million dollars 22 23 shall be transferred to the Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund to fund the Excellence in Teaching Act, and the amount remaining in the 24 Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after administrative 25

1 expenses, for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to

2 sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.

3 (c) For fiscal year 2011-12, the Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated as follows: (i) The first two hundred twenty-4 5 five thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Excellence in 6 Teaching Cash Fund to fund the Attracting Excellence to Teaching 7 (ii) the next three million three hundred sixty-five Program; 8 thousand nine hundred sixty-two dollars shall be distributed to school districts as grants pursuant to the Early Childhood Education 9 Grant Program; (iii) the next two million one hundred seventy-five 10 11 thousand six hundred seventy-three dollars shall be distributed to 12 local systems as grants for approved accelerated or differentiated 13 curriculum programs for students identified as learners with high 14 ability pursuant to section 79-1108.02; (iv) the next four hundred ninety-one thousand five hundred forty-one dollars shall be used by 15 the State Department of Education for the development of 16 integrated early childhood, elementary, secondary, and postsecondary 17 student information system; (v) the next four hundred fifty thousand 18 dollars shall fund the Center for Student Leadership and Extended 19 20 Learning Act; (vi) the next one hundred fourteen thousand six hundred twenty-nine dollars shall fund the multicultural education program 21 created under section 79-720; (vii) the next one hundred twenty-three 22 23 thousand four hundred sixty-eight dollars shall be used by the 24 department to employ persons to investigate and prosecute alleged violations as provided in section 79-868; (viii) up to the next one 25

hundred sixty thousand dollars shall be used by the department to 1 2 implement section 79-759; and (ix) the amount remaining shall be 3 allocated, after administrative expenses, for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337. 4 5 (d) For fiscal year 2012-13, the Education Innovation 6 Fund shall be allocated as follows: (i) The first forty five thousand 7 one million dollars shall be transferred to the Excellence in 8 Teaching Cash Fund to fund the Attracting Excellence to Teaching (ii) the next three million three hundred sixty-five 9 Program; thousand nine hundred sixty-two dollars shall be distributed to 10 11 school districts as grants pursuant to the Early Childhood Education 12 Grant Program; (iii) the next two million one hundred seventy-five 13 thousand six hundred seventy-three dollars shall be distributed to 14 local systems as grants for approved accelerated or differentiated 15 curriculum programs for students identified as learners with high ability pursuant to section 79-1108.02; (iv) the next one hundred 16 17 eight thousand one hundred thirty-six dollars shall be used by the department for the development of an integrated early childhood, 18 elementary, secondary, and postsecondary student information system; 19 20 (v) the next four hundred fifty thousand dollars shall fund the Center for Student Leadership and Extended Learning Act; (vi) the 21 next one hundred fourteen thousand six hundred twenty-nine dollars 22

shall be used by the department to fund the multicultural education

program created under section 79-720; (vii) the next one hundred

twenty-three thousand four hundred sixty-eight dollars shall be used

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by the department to employ persons to investigate and prosecute 1 2 alleged violations as provided in section 79-868; (viii) up to the next one hundred sixty thousand dollars shall be used by the 3 department to implement section 79-759; (ix) the next twenty-seven 4 5 thousand two hundred dollars shall be used to fund the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children; and (x) the 6 7 amount remaining shall be allocated, after administrative expenses, 8 for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 9 79-1336 and 79-1337. (e) For fiscal year 2013-14, the Education Innovation 10 Fund shall be allocated as follows: (i) The first one million dollars 11 12 shall be transferred to the Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund to fund 13 the Excellence in Teaching Act; (ii) the next allocation shall be distributed to local systems as grants for approved accelerated or 14 15 differentiated curriculum programs for students identified 16 learners with high ability pursuant to section 79-1108.02 in an aggregated amount up to the amount distributed in the prior fiscal 17 year for such purposes increased by the basic allowable growth rate 18 pursuant to section 79-1025; (iii) the next allocation shall be used 19 20 by the State Department of Education for the integrated early 21 childhood, elementary, secondary, and postsecondary student 22 information system in an aggregated amount up to the amount used in 23 the prior fiscal year for such purposes increased by the basic

allowable growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (iv) the next

allocation shall fund the Center for Student Leadership and Extended

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Learning Act in an aggregated amount up to the amount used in the 1 2 prior fiscal year for such purposes increased by the basic allowable growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (v) the next allocation 3 4 shall be used by the department to fund the multicultural education 5 program created under section 79-720 in an aggregated amount up to the amount used in the prior fiscal year for such purposes increased 6 7 by the basic allowable growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (vi) 8 the next allocation shall be used by the department to employ persons 9 to investigate and prosecute alleged violations as provided in 10 section 79-868 in an aggregated amount up to the amount used in the prior fiscal year for such purposes increased by the basic allowable 11 12 growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (vii) up to the next one 13 hundred sixty thousand dollars shall be used by the department to 14 implement section 79-759; and (viii) the amount remaining shall be 15 allocated, after administrative expenses, for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337. 16 17 (f) For fiscal years 2014-15 and 2015-16, the Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated as follows: (i) The first one 18 million dollars shall be transferred to the Excellence in Teaching 19 20 Cash Fund to fund the Excellence in Teaching Act; (ii) the next allocation shall be distributed to local systems as grants for 21 approved accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs 22 23 students identified as learners with high ability pursuant to section 79-1108.02 in an aggregated amount up to the amount distributed in 24 the prior fiscal year for such purposes increased by the basic 25

allowable growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (iii) the next 1 2 allocation shall be used by the State Department of Education for the 3 integrated early childhood, elementary, secondary, and postsecondary student information system in an aggregated amount up to the amount 4 5 used in the prior fiscal year for such purposes increased by the 6 basic allowable growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (iv) the 7 next allocation shall fund the Center for Student Leadership and 8 Extended Learning Act in an aggregated amount up to the amount used 9 in the prior fiscal year for such purposes increased by the basic allowable growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (v) the next 10 allocation shall be used by the department to fund the multicultural 11 12 education program created under section 79-720 in an aggregated 13 amount up to the amount used in the prior fiscal year for such 14 purposes increased by the basic allowable growth rate pursuant to 15 section 79-1025; (vi) the next allocation shall be used by the 16 department to employ persons to investigate and prosecute alleged violations as provided in section 79-868 in an aggregated amount up 17 to the amount used in the prior fiscal year for such purposes 18 19 increased by the basic allowable growth rate pursuant to section 20 79-1025; and (vii) the amount remaining shall be allocated, after 21 administrative expenses, for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337. 22 23 For fiscal year 2016-17 and each fiscal year (g) thereafter, the Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after 24

administrative expenses, for education purposes as provided by the

- 3 the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, the State Lottery Prize Trust
- 4 Fund, or the Education Innovation Fund available for investment shall

- 6 Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
