5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 69-206, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 69-206 No personal property received or purchased by any pawnbroker, dealer in secondhand goods, or junk dealer, shall be sold 4 5 or permitted to be taken from the place of business of such person 6 for fourteen days or, in the case of secondhand jewelry, for five 7 days, after the copy of the card or ledger entry required to be 8 delivered to the police department or sheriff's office shall have been delivered as required by section 69-205. Secondhand jewelry 9 shall not be destroyed, damaged, or in any manner defaced for a 10 period of seventy-two hours fourteen days after the time of its 11 12 purchase or receipt. For purposes of this section, jewelry shall mean 13 any ornament which is intended to be worn on or about the body and 14 which is made in whole or in part of any precious metal, including 15 gold, silver, platinum, copper, brass, or pewter.

16 All property accepted as collateral security or purchased by a pawnbroker shall be kept segregated from all other property in a 17 18 separate area for a period of forty-eight hours after its receipt or purchase, except that valuable articles may be kept in a safe with 19 20 other property if grouped according to the day of purchase or 21 receipt. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, a pawnbroker may return any property to the person pawning the same after the 22 23 expiration of such forty-eight-hour period or when permitted by the chief of police, sheriff, or other authorized law enforcement 24 25 officer.
