This bill would change provisions relating to hearsay, child abuse, and offenses relating to morals. It requires the Crime Commission to establish and maintain a central repository for the collection and analysis of information regarding the offenses of labor trafficking, labor trafficking of a minor, sex trafficking, and sex trafficking of a minor. The bill also outright repeals section 28-832: Human trafficking; Attorney General; Department of Health and Human Services; duties.

As of January 31, 2013, the inmate population was 145.01% of design capacity.

Explanation of Estimate: Section 13 of LB 255 requires the Crime Commission to establish and maintain a central repository for the collection and analysis of information regarding the offenses of labor trafficking, labor trafficking of a minor, sex trafficking, and sex trafficking of a minor. After we establish this repository we are required to develop a procedure to monitor, record, classify, and analyze information relating to such offenses.

The Crime Commission has a small but highly experienced Information Technology staff. However, to absorb this additional workload we will need a .50 statistical clerk position and a small operating budget. This position will be responsible for monitoring court cases, identified electronically by statute numbers, and recording the data in a database for compilation and reporting. This will provide filing and disposition data. We will also use arrest data collected through our uniform crime reporting system. The cost of the position and operating costs are reflected in this fiscal note.

In addition, the bill could require the Department to investigate situations in which an alleged perpetrator is out of home. Those cases are currently investigated solely by law enforcement. These provisions could increase work load at both the Hotline and for initial assessment requiring additional staff, however the possible number of cases is unknown so the Department determines that there is no fiscal impact.

Section 4 of LB 255 requires courts to publish and update a list of those convicted of solicitation or attempted solicitation of prostitution and to mail a written notice to persons convicted that they will be included in the published list.

Assumptions:

- 1. Each individual court that had a conviction would maintain a list and mail the notices. There would be no central registry.
- 2. Since "publish" is not defined, this requirement could be fulfilled by a notice posted at the courthouse or notices in a local newspaper rather than, for example, a central website.

Based on these assumptions there would be no fiscal impact to the Supreme Court. Any expenses would be from county funds allocated to county and district courts.

If these assumptions are not correct, there could be a fiscal impact to the Supreme Court which would need to be determined.
