Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 493 would allow the Game and Parks Commission to lease or otherwise transfer portions of the Cowboy Trail to a political subdivision, and lease portions to a nonprofit organization. The lessee or transferee shall maintain the property at their own expense.

Since the bill is permissive it is unknown when or if such leases or transfers will take place. If the some portions of the Cowboy Trail are actually leased or transferred the Commission's related expenses and revenue would decrease accordingly. Until such time that a lease or transfer takes place the bill represents no fiscal impact.

Technical note: The Commission has indicated that since the property has been "rail-banked" there may be federal restrictions on transferring the property. Please see the attached Game and Parks Commission fiscal note for additional details.

Portions of the trail have not been fully developed as an active component of the Cowboy Trail. Expenses have been primarily limited to noxious weed control on those portions. Additionally portions of the trail have also been leased for haying. Depending upon which, if any, portions are actually leased or transferred there could be a decrease in revenue as well as expenses. Since no specific portions are identified, no definitive fiscal impact can be estimated, although it is not expected to be significant.

It is anticipated that any transfer of portions of the trail would be subject to the review and approval of the Surface Transportation Board and subject to possible restrictions related to federal Transportation Enhancement funding.
