LB740 would make veterans who have been off active duty for 2 years or less, their spouses, and their dependents eligible for resident tuition rates at public colleges and universities in Nebraska. The veteran shall be considered a resident if he or she is registered to vote in Nebraska and demonstrates an intent to be a resident.

The impact is estimated as follows:
