3 Section 1. Section 60-462, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
4 2014, is amended to read:

60-462 Sections 60-462 to 60-4,189 and section 4 of this act shall
be known and may be cited as the Motor Vehicle Operator's License Act.

Sec. 2. Section 60-479, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2014, is amended to read:

9 60-479 Sections 60-479.01 to 60-4,111.01, 60-4,113, 60-4,114,
10 60-4,115 to 60-4,118, and 60-4,182 to 60-4,189 <u>and section 4 of this act</u>
11 shall apply to any operator's license subject to the Motor Vehicle
12 Operator's License Act.

Sec. 3. Section 60-480, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2014, is amended to read:

60-480 Operators' licenses issued by the department pursuant to the
 Motor Vehicle Operator's License Act shall be classified as follows:

(1) Class O license. The operator's license which authorizes the
person to whom it is issued to operate on highways any motor vehicle
except a commercial motor vehicle or motorcycle;

(2) Class M license. The operator's license or endorsement on a
Class O license, provisional operator's permit, learner's permit, school
permit, or commercial driver's license which authorizes the person to
whom it is issued to operate a motorcycle on highways;

(3) CDL-commercial driver's license. The operator's license which
authorizes the person to whom it is issued to operate a class of
commercial motor vehicle or any motor vehicle, except a motorcycle, on

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1 highways;

(4) CLP-commercial learner's permit. A permit which when carried 2 3 with a Class O license authorizes an individual to operate a class of commercial motor vehicle when accompanied by a holder of a valid 4 5 commercial driver's license for purposes of behind-the-wheel training. 6 When issued to a commercial driver's license holder, a CLP-commercial 7 learner's permit serves as authorization for accompanied behind-the-wheel 8 training in a commercial motor vehicle for which the holder's current 9 commercial driver's license is not valid;

(5) RCDL-restricted commercial driver's license. The class of 10 11 commercial driver's license which, when held with an annual seasonal 12 permit, authorizes a seasonal commercial motor vehicle operator as defined in section 60-4,146.01 to operate any Class B Heavy Straight 13 14 Vehicle or Class C Small Vehicle commercial motor vehicle for purposes of 15 a farm-related or ranch-related service industry as defined in such section within one hundred fifty miles of the employer's place of 16 17 business or the farm or ranch currently being served as provided in such section or any other motor vehicle, except a motorcycle, on highways; 18

(6) POP-provisional operator's permit. A motor vehicle operating permit with restrictions issued pursuant to section 60-4,120.01 to a person who is at least sixteen years of age but less than eighteen years of age which authorizes the person to operate any motor vehicle except a commercial motor vehicle or motorcycle;

(7) SCP-school permit. A permit issued to a student between fourteen
years and two months of age and sixteen years of age for the purpose of
driving in accordance with the requirements of section 60-4,124;

(8) FMP-farm permit. A permit issued to a person for purposes of
operating farm tractors and other motorized implements of farm husbandry
on highways in accordance with the requirements of section 60-4,126;

30 (9) LPD-learner's permit. A permit issued in accordance with the 31 requirements of section 60-4,123 to a person at least fifteen years of

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1 age which authorizes the person to operate a motor vehicle, except a 2 commercial motor vehicle, for learning purposes when accompanied by a 3 licensed operator who is at least twenty-one years of age and who 4 possesses a valid operator's license issued by this state or another 5 state;

6 (10) LPE-learner's permit. A permit issued to a person at least 7 fourteen years of age which authorizes the person to operate a motor 8 vehicle, except a commercial motor vehicle, while learning to drive in 9 preparation for application for a school permit;

10 (11) EDP-employment driving permit. A permit issued to a person 11 which authorizes the person to operate a motor vehicle, except a 12 commercial motor vehicle, pursuant to the requirements of sections 13 60-4,129 and 60-4,130;

14 (12) IIP-ignition interlock permit. A permit issued to a person 15 which authorizes the person to operate a motor vehicle, except a 16 commercial motor vehicle, which is equipped with an ignition interlock 17 device;

(13) SEP-seasonal permit. A permit issued to a person who holds a restricted commercial driver's license authorizing the person to operate a commercial motor vehicle, as prescribed by section 60-4,146.01, for no more than one hundred eighty consecutive days in any twelve-month period. The seasonal permit shall be valid and run from the date of original issuance of the permit for one hundred eighty days and from the date of annual revalidation of the permit;<u>and</u>

25 (14) MHP-medical hardship driving permit. A permit issued to a 26 person which authorizes the person to operate a motor vehicle, except a 27 commercial motor vehicle, pursuant to the requirements of sections 28 60-4,130.01 and 60-4,130.02; and -

(15) DPC-driving privilege card. A card issued in accordance with
 section 4 of this act which authorizes the person to operate a motor
 vehicle as provided in this section other than subdivisions (3), (4),

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1 (5), and (13) of this section, but which may not be accepted by a governmental entity as proof of personal identification, and which is 2 3 temporary pursuant to section 60-484.05. 4 Sec. 4. (1) The department shall only issue a driving privilege card 5 to a person presenting unexpired documents claiming lawful presence under the program of the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services 6 7 known as Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals as it existed on January 8 <u>1, 2015.</u> 9 (2) The driving privilege card shall be visually distinctive from any other operator's license and shall clearly display on the front of 10 11 the card a phrase substantially similar to DRIVING PRIVILEGE - NOT VALID 12 IDENTIFICATION FOR NEBRASKA GOVERNMENT ENTITY. Sec. 5. Section 60-484.04, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 13 14 2014, is amended to read: 15 60-484.04 (1) The Legislature finds and declares that section 202(c) 16 (2)(B)(i) through (ix) of the federal REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law 17 109-13, enumerated categories of individuals who may demonstrate lawful status for the purpose of eligibility for a federally secure motor 18 19 vehicle operator's license or state identification card. The Legislature 20 further finds and declares that it was the intent of the Legislature in 21 2011 to adopt the enumerated categories by the passage of Laws 2011, LB 22 215. The Legislature declares that the passage of this legislative bill 23 is for the limited purpose of reaffirming the original legislative intent 24 of Laws 2011, LB 215. Except as provided in section 60-4,144 with respect 25 to operators of commercial motor vehicles, before being issued any other 26 type of operator's license or a state identification card under the Motor 27 Vehicle Operator's License Act, the department shall require an applicant 28 to present valid documentary evidence that he or she has lawful status in 29 the United States as enumerated in section 202(c)(2)(B)(i) through (ix) 30 of the federal REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law 109-13, except that if the 31 applicant presents unexpired documents claiming lawful presence under the

program of the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services known 1 2 as Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals as it existed on January 1, 3 2015, the applicant may only be issued a driving privilege card. Lawful status may be shown by: 4 5

(a) A valid, unexpired United States passport;

6 (b) A certified copy of a birth certificate filed with a state 7 office of vital statistics or equivalent agency in the individual's state 8 of birth;

9 (c) A Consular Report of Birth Abroad (CRBA) issued by the United States Department of State, Form FS-240, DS-1350, or FS-545; 10

(d) A valid, unexpired Permanent Resident Card (Form I-551) issued 11 12 by the United States Department of Homeland Security or United States Citizenship and Immigration Services; 13

14 (e) An unexpired employment authorization document (EAD) issued by 15 the United States Department of Homeland Security, Form I-766 or Form I-688B; 16

17 (f) An unexpired foreign passport with a valid, unexpired United States visa affixed accompanied by the approved I-94 form documenting the 18 applicant's most recent admittance into the United States; 19

20 (q) A Certificate of Naturalization issued by the United States 21 Department of Homeland Security, Form N-550 or Form N-570;

22 (h) A Certificate of Citizenship, Form N-560 or Form N-561, issued 23 by the United States Department of Homeland Security;

24 (i) A driver's license or identification card issued in compliance with the standards established by the REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law 25 26 109-13, division B, section 1, 119 Stat. 302; or

27 (j) Such other documents as the director may approve.

(2)(a) If an applicant presents one of the documents listed under 28 29 subdivision (1)(a), (b), (c), (d), (g), or (h) of this section, the 30 verification of the applicant's identity in the manner prescribed in section 60-484 will also provide satisfactory evidence of lawful status. 31

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(b) If the applicant presents one of the identity documents listed 1 2 under subdivision (1)(e), (f), or (i) of this section, the verification 3 of the identity documents does not provide satisfactory evidence of lawful status. The applicant must also present a second document from 4 5 subsection (1) of this section or documentation issued by the United 6 States Department of Homeland Security, the United States Citizenship and 7 Immigration Services, or other federal agencies demonstrating that the 8 applicant has lawful status as enumerated in section 202(c)(2)(B)(i) 9 through (ix) of the federal REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law 109-13, such as one of the types of Form I-797 used by the United States Citizenship 10 11 and Immigration Services, except that if the applicant presents unexpired 12 documents claiming lawful presence under the program of the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services known as Deferred Action for 13 14 Childhood Arrivals as it existed on January 1, 2015, the applicant may 15 only be issued a driving privilege card determined by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services. 16

17 (3) An applicant may present other documents as designated by the director as proof of lawful status as enumerated in section 202(c)(2)(B) 18 (i) through (ix) of the federal REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law 109-13, 19 20 except that if the applicant presents unexpired documents claiming lawful 21 presence under the program of the United States Citizenship and 22 Immigration Services known as Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals as 23 it existed on January 1, 2015, the applicant may only be issued a driving 24 privilege card. Any documents accepted shall be recorded according to a written exceptions process established by the director. 25

26 Sec. 6. Section 60-484.05, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 27 2014, is amended to read:

60-484.05 (1) The department shall only issue an operator's license or a state identification card that is temporary to any applicant who presents documentation under sections 60-484 and 60-484.04 that shows his or her authorized stay in the United States is temporary. An operator's

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1 license or a state identification card that is temporary shall be valid 2 only during the period of time of the applicant's authorized stay in the 3 United States or, if there is no definite end to the period of authorized 4 stay, a period of one year.

5 (2) An operator's license or state identification card that is 6 temporary shall clearly indicate that it is temporary with a special 7 notation on the front of the license or card and shall state the date on 8 which it expires.

9 (3) An operator's license or state identification card that is 10 temporary may be renewed only upon presentation of valid documentary 11 evidence that the status by which the applicant qualified for the 12 operator's license or state identification card that is temporary has 13 been extended by the United States Department of Homeland Security.

14 (4) If the department has information that an individual has an 15 operator's license or a state identification card issued based on 16 approved lawful status granted under section 202(c)(2)(B)(i) through (ix) of the federal REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law 109-13, and the basis for 17 the approved lawful status is terminated or that an individual no longer 18 has lawful presence as documented under section 60-484.04, the department 19 may summarily cancel the license or card and send notice of the 20 21 cancellation to the licensee or cardholder.

Sec. 7. Section 60-4,115, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2014, is amended to read:

24 60-4,115 (1) Fees for operators' licenses and state identification cards shall be collected and distributed according to the table in 25 26 subsection (2) of this section, except for the ignition interlock permit 27 and associated fees as outlined in subsection (4) of this section. County officials shall remit the county portion of the fees collected to the 28 29 county treasurer for placement in the county general fund. All other fees 30 collected shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the 31 appropriate fund.

(3) If the department issues an operator's license or a state
identification card, the department shall remit the county portion of the
fees to the State Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor
Vehicles Cash Fund.

(4)(a) The fee for an ignition interlock permit shall be forty-five
dollars. Five dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer
for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund. Forty dollars
of the fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the
Department of Motor Vehicles Ignition Interlock Fund.

(b) The fee for a replacement ignition interlock permit shall beeleven dollars. Two dollars and seventy-five cents of the fee shall be

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1 remitted to the county treasurer for credit to the county general fund.
2 Six dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for
3 credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund. Two dollars and
4 twenty-five cents of the fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for
5 credit to the General Fund.

6 (c) The fee for adding, changing, or removing a class, endorsement, 7 or restriction on an ignition interlock permit shall be five dollars. The 8 fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the Department 9 of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.

10 <u>(5) The fee for a driving privilege card shall be the same as the</u> 11 <u>fee established by subsection (2) of this section for any type of</u> 12 <u>operator's license or class, endorsement, or restriction other than any</u> 13 <u>type of commercial driver's license or permit.</u>

14 $(\underline{6} \ \underline{5})$ The department and its agents may collect an identity security 15 surcharge to cover the cost of security and technology practices used to protect the identity of applicants for and holders of operators' licenses 16 17 and state identification cards and to reduce identity theft, fraud, and forgery and counterfeiting of such licenses and cards to the maximum 18 extent possible. The surcharge shall be in addition to all other required 19 20 fees for operators' licenses and state identification cards. The amount 21 of the surcharge shall be determined by the department. The surcharge 22 shall not exceed eight dollars. The surcharge shall be remitted to the 23 State Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund. Sec. 8. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2016. 24
