Explanation of Estimate:

LB 189 will result in additional testing that will need to be performed by the Nebraska State Patrol Crime Lab. It may result in additional testing by the Nebraska State Patrol Crime Lab of marijuana possessed by individuals in quantities of less than an ounce. Additionally, in regards to industrial hemp, the bill results in a larger burden of work in that the State Patrol may have to show through testing that the substance is not industrial hemp in order to prove it is a controlled substance. This may cause an increase in the requests by prosecutors to have concentration testing done on plant material samples. Because of the increase in testing that will result from the bill, the State Patrol estimates the need for an additional forensic scientist, an additional gas chromatograph with computer for initial sample screening, and an additional gas chromatograph mass spectrometer with computer and software for sample confirmatory testing.
