Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

Current statues provide that the investment income from the Nebraska Veterans' Aid Fund may be spent to furnish food, shelter, fuel, wearing apparel, medical or surgical aid, and to assist with funeral expenses of veterans. LB 305 would add "transportation" to the list of eligible expenses.

Since the amount of money available for aid distributed to veterans is limited to the amount of investment income generated off of the Nebraska Veterans' Aid Fund, the addition of transportation expenses to the list may not increase overall expenditures for aid, but it could limit the amount of money that can be spent on the other categories of assistance.
