Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

This bill establishes the Home Care Consumer Bill of Rights Act. The act requires a provider of home care is required to disclose specific information and provide a copy of the Act to the consumer. The consumer has a right to participate in the planning of services, to sufficient information to make informed decisions and information in advance on any proposed changes of services, be informed about the cost of the care. Additionally the consumer has the right to receive a prompt responses from the entity in which a complaint is filed. Violations of the disclosure provisions are subject to a civil penalty of \$100 for each violation up to a maximum of \$1,000. The consumer may contact the Consumer Protection Division in the office of the Attorney General, the State Unit on Aging, the long-term care ombudsman, the protection and advocacy system or other state and local agencies responsible for or interested in the rights of home care consumers.

The Department of Health and Human Services estimates a high number of complaints that would be received by their agency. It is unlikely to reach this level. An additional resource development position may be needed. The costs would be \$54,888 in FY 17 and \$52,888 in FY 18. The Consumer Protection Division in the office of the Attorney General is another place where complaints can be filed. An additional attorney and legal assistant will be needed. The cost will be \$201,780 in FY 17 and FY 18 paid from cash funds.

Explanation of Estimate:

To meet the informational literature requirements in LB 698, the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) would require a Resource Development worker. The cost would be \$64,049 GF for FY17 and \$64,049 GF for SFY18 in Program 266.

To comply with the requirements of section 5 (2) DHHS would need one Unit Manager and one contractor in FY17 and FY18 to begin setting up the program, including writing rules and regulations for the grievance procedures, provide education training for staff, providers and clients, organize statewide service and many other duties, at an estimated cost of \$153,179 GF (Contractor at \$50,000 and unit Manager at \$103,179.) Additionally, three Aging Services Ombudsman staff would be needed in FY18 to begin providing program service at an estimated cost of \$251,541 GF.

The total fiscal impact to the Department of Health and Human Services in SFY17 will be \$220,228 GF and in FY18 \$471,769 GF.

Complete program operation with full staffing would not be reached until FY19. The complete program with full staff will include one Resource Developer, one Unit Manager, and nine Aging Services Ombudsman at an estimated \$923,850 GF.
