- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Cremation of Human Remains Act; to amend sections 71-1355, 71-1382, and 80-104, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 71-1356, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014; to define and redefine terms; to provide for disposition of certain unclaimed cremated remains in a veteran cemetery as prescribed; to harmonize provisions; and to
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

repeal the original sections.

1 Section 1. Section 71-1355, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 3 71-1355 Sections 71-1355 to 71-1385 and section 4 of this act shall
- 4 be known and may be cited as the Cremation of Human Remains Act.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 71-1356, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 6 2014, is amended to read:
- 7 71-1356 For purposes of the Cremation of Human Remains Act, unless
- 8 the context otherwise requires:
- 9 (1) Alternative container means a container in which human remains
- 10 are placed in a cremation chamber for cremation;
- 11 (2) Authorizing agent means a person vested with the right to
- 12 control the disposition of human remains pursuant to section 30-2223 or a
- 13 person authorized on the decedent's United States Department of Defense
- 14 record of emergency data, DD Form 93, or its successor form, as provided
- 15 in section 38-1425;
- 16 (3) Casket means a rigid container made of wood, metal, or other
- 17 similar material, ornamented and lined with fabric, which is designed for
- 18 the encasement of human remains;
- 19 (4) Cremated remains means the residue of human remains recovered
- 20 after cremation and the processing of such remains by pulverization,
- 21 leaving only bone fragments reduced to unidentifiable dimensions, and the
- 22 unrecoverable residue of any foreign matter, such as eyeglasses,
- 23 bridgework, or other similar material, that was cremated with the human
- 24 remains;
- 25 (5) Cremated remains receipt form means a form provided by a
- 26 crematory authority to an authorizing agent or his or her representative
- 27 that identifies cremated remains and the person authorized to receive
- 28 such remains;
- 29 (6) Cremation means the technical process that uses heat and
- 30 evaporation to reduce human remains to bone fragments;
- 31 (7) Cremation chamber means the enclosed space within which a

- 1 cremation takes place;
- 2 (8) Crematory means a building or portion of a building which
- 3 contains a cremation chamber and holding facility;
- 4 (9) Crematory authority means the legal entity subject to licensure
- 5 by the department to maintain and operate a crematory and perform
- 6 cremation;
- 7 (10) Crematory operator means a person who is responsible for the
- 8 operation of a crematory;
- 9 (11) Delivery receipt form means a form provided by a funeral
- 10 establishment to a crematory authority to document the receipt of human
- 11 remains by such authority for the purpose of cremation;
- 12 (12) Department means the Division of Public Health of the
- 13 Department of Health and Human Services;
- 14 (13) Director means the Director of Public Health of the Division of
- 15 Public Health;
- 16 (14) Funeral director has the same meaning as in section 71-507;
- 17 (15) Funeral establishment has the same meaning as in section
- 18 38-1411;
- 19 (16) Holding facility means the area of a crematory designated for
- 20 the retention of human remains prior to cremation and includes a
- 21 refrigerated facility;
- 22 (17) Human remains means the body of a deceased person, or a human
- 23 body part, in any stage of decomposition and includes limbs or other
- 24 portions of the anatomy that are removed from a person or human remains
- 25 for medical purposes during treatment, surgery, biopsy, autopsy, or
- 26 medical research;
- 27 (18) Permanent container means a receptacle made of durable material
- 28 for the long-term placement of cremated remains;—and
- 29 (19) Temporary container means a receptacle made of cardboard,
- 30 plastic, or other similar material in which cremated remains are placed
- 31 prior to the placement of such remains in an urn or other permanent

- 1 container; -
- 2 (20) Veteran means a person who served on active duty as a member of
- 3 the United States Armed Services, a member of the Nebraska National
- 4 Guard, or a member of the United States Reserved Forces, who was
- 5 <u>discharged or released from such service under conditions other than</u>
- 6 dishonorable, and who is eligible for burial in a veteran cemetery;
- 7 (21) Veteran cemetery means a cemetery under the control of the
- 8 <u>United States Department of Veterans Affairs National Cemetery</u>
- 9 Administration or the Nebraska Department of Veterans' Affairs; and
- 10 (22) Veterans service organization means an association,
- 11 corporation, or other entity that is:
- 12 <u>(a) A charitable organization that is tax exempt under section</u>
- 13 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(19) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986; and
- 14 (b) Organized for the benefit of veterans burial and interment and
- 15 recognized by the Memorial Affairs Division of the United States
- 16 Department of Veterans Affairs or the Nebraska Department of Veterans'
- 17 Affairs. The term includes a member or employee of an eligible nonprofit
- 18 veterans association, corporation, or entity that specifically assists in
- 19 <u>facilitating the identification, recovery, and interment of the unclaimed</u>
- 20 <u>cremated remains of veterans.</u>
- 21 Sec. 3. Section 71-1382, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 22 amended to read:
- 23 71-1382 (1) For purposes of the Cremation of Human Remains Act, the
- 24 delivery of the cremated remains to the authorizing agent or his or her
- 25 representative shall constitute final disposition. If, after a period of
- 26 sixty days after the date of cremation, the authorizing agent or his or
- 27 her representative has not directed or otherwise arranged for the final
- 28 disposition of the cremated remains or claimed the cremated remains for
- 29 final disposition as provided in this section, the crematory authority or
- 30 the funeral establishment in possession of the cremated remains may
- 31 dispose of the cremated remains after making a reasonable attempt to

- 1 contact the authorizing agent or his or her representative. This method
- 2 of disposition may be used by any crematory authority or funeral
- 3 establishment to dispose of all cremated remains in the possession of a
- 4 crematory authority or funeral establishment on or after August 31, 2003.
- 5 (2)(a) Cremated remains shall be delivered or released by the
- 6 crematory authority or funeral establishment to the representative
- 7 specified by the authorizing agent on the cremation authorization form.
- 8 <u>(b) If the crematory authority or funeral establishment has</u>
- 9 documentation that the cremated remains are those of a veteran or the
- 10 spouse or dependent of a veteran who did not desire any funeral or
- 11 <u>burial-related services or ceremonies recognizing his or her service as a</u>
- 12 <u>veteran and the authorizing agent or his or her representative has not</u>
- 13 <u>directed or otherwise arranged for the final disposition or claimed the</u>
- 14 <u>remains after such sixty-day period, the crematory authority or funeral</u>
- 15 <u>establishment may dispose of the remains.</u>
- 16 (c) If the crematory authority or funeral establishment (i) has no
- 17 <u>information whether the cremated remains are those of a veteran or the</u>
- 18 spouse or dependent of a veteran or (ii) has information that the
- 19 <u>cremated remains are those of a veteran or the spouse or dependent of a</u>
- 20 <u>veteran but no information on whether such veteran desired a service</u>
- 21 recognizing his or her service as a veteran, the crematory authority or
- 22 funeral establishment may use the process provided in section 4 of this
- 23 act to relinquish control of such cremated remains.
- 24 (d) The owner of the crematory authority or his or her
- 25 representative and the party receiving the cremated remains shall sign a
- 26 cremated remains receipt form. The form shall include the name of the
- 27 deceased, the date, time, and place of receipt of the cremated remains,
- 28 and the signatures of the owner of the crematory or his or her
- 29 representative and the authorizing agent or his or her representative. If
- 30 the cremated remains are shipped, a form used by the shipper under
- 31 subsection (4) of section 71-1381 may be used in lieu of a completed

- 1 cremated remains receipt form if the shipper's form contains the
- 2 information required for a cremated remains receipt form. Both the party
- 3 delivering such remains and the party receiving such remains shall retain
- 4 a copy of the cremated remains receipt form or shipper's form. Upon
- 5 delivery, the cremated remains may be further transported within this
- 6 state in any manner without a permit.
- 7 Sec. 4. (1)(a) If the authorizing agent or his or her
- 8 representative has not directed or otherwise arranged for the final
- 9 disposition of cremated remains or claimed cremated remains for final
- 10 <u>disposition as provided in section 71-1382, the crematory authority or</u>
- 11 <u>funeral establishment may provide information regarding the unclaimed</u>
- 12 <u>remains to the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, the Nebraska</u>
- 13 Department of Veterans' Affairs, or a veterans service organization and
- 14 request that the department or the veterans service organization working
- 15 with the department:
- 16 (i) Determine if, based on the information received, the unclaimed
- 17 cremated remains are those of a veteran or the spouse or dependent of a
- 18 veteran; and
- 19 (ii) Verify if the decedent is eligible for burial in a veteran
- 20 <u>cemetery.</u>
- 21 (b) The information provided to the department may include a copy of
- 22 the person's death certificate, the person's name, date of birth, place
- 23 of birth, date of death, marriage certificate, social security number,
- 24 military service number, branch of service, or military rank on date of
- 25 death, or the Department of Defense Form 214, also known as the DD Form
- 26 214.
- (c) The information submitted by the crematory authority or funeral
- 28 establishment to the Nebraska Department of Veterans' Affairs shall not
- 29 <u>be considered a public record for purposes of sections 84-712 to</u>
- 30 84-712.09.
- 31 (2) If the crematory authority or funeral establishment receives

- 1 notification of a determination by the United States Department of
- 2 <u>Veterans Affairs or the Nebraska Department of Veterans' Affairs that the</u>
- 3 <u>unclaimed cremated remains are those of a veteran or the spouse or</u>
- 4 dependent of a veteran and such person is eligible for burial in a
- 5 <u>veteran cemetery, then the crematory authority or funeral establishment</u>
- 6 <u>may relinquish control of such remains to a veterans service organization</u>
- 7 <u>or a designated member or employee of such organization.</u>
- 8 (3)(a) The veterans service organization shall provide disposition
- 9 of the remains of such veteran or the spouse or dependent of a veteran
- 10 with a funeral at a veteran cemetery after:
- 11 (i) The veterans service organization has made reasonable efforts to
- 12 <u>locate the authorizing agent to notify him or her of the veterans service</u>
- 13 organization's intent to claim the cremated remains for the purpose of
- 14 providing disposition in accordance with this section;
- 15 (ii) The cremated remains of such veteran or the spouse or dependent
- 16 of a veteran have been in the possession of the veterans service
- 17 organization for a period of at least one year; and
- 18 (iii) No attempt has been made to claim the unclaimed cremated
- 19 remains by the authorizing agent within such one-year period.
- 20 <u>(b) The veterans service organization may provide disposition of</u>
- 21 cremated remains by placement in a tomb, mausoleum, crypt, or columbarium
- 22 in a veteran cemetery or by burial in a veteran cemetery but shall not
- 23 scatter the cremated remains.
- 24 (4) If the crematory authority or funeral establishment relinquishes
- 25 control of the unclaimed cremated remains to a veterans service
- 26 organization, it shall:
- 27 (a) Establish and maintain a record identifying the veterans service
- 28 organization receiving the remains; and
- 29 <u>(b) Retain such record for five years from the date of transfer of</u>
- 30 the remains to the veterans service organization.
- 31 (5) A crematory operator, funeral director, crematory authority,

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- 1 funeral establishment, or veterans service organization shall not be
- 2 <u>liable for the disposition of cremated remains in accordance with this</u>
- 3 section unless there is gross negligence or willful misconduct.
- 4 Sec. 5. Section 80-104, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 5 amended to read:
- 6 80-104 Except for cremated remains disposed of as provided in
- 7 section 4 of this act, it It shall be the duty of the county veterans
- 8 service committee to cause to be decently interred the body of any person
- 9 who has been discharged or otherwise separated with a characterization of
- 10 honorable or general (under honorable conditions) from any arm of the
- 11 military or naval service of the United States, has served during a
- 12 period of war, as defined in section 80-401.01, or during a period of
- 13 actual hostilities in any war or conflict in which the United States
- 14 Government was engaged prior to April 6, 1917, and may hereafter die
- 15 without leaving sufficient means to defray his or her funeral expenses.
- 16 Such burials should not be made in any cemetery or burial grounds used
- 17 exclusively for the burial of pauper dead. If surviving relatives of the
- 18 deceased shall desire to conduct the funeral, they shall be permitted to
- 19 do so.
