1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nursing Home Administrator Practice
2	Act; to amend sections 38-2408, 38-2412, 38-2421, and 38-2422,
3	Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 38-2401, 38-2402,
4	38-2419, and 38-2420, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014;
5	to change provisions regarding educational requirements for and
6	licensure of nursing home administrators; to change and eliminate
7	definitions; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the original
8	sections; and to outright repeal sections 38-2403, 38-2409, 38-2410,
9	38-2413, 38-2415, and 38-2416, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska.
10	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 38-2401, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2014, is amended to read:

3 38-2401 Sections 38-2401 to 38-2426 and section 6 of this act shall
4 be known and may be cited as the Nursing Home Administrator Practice Act.
5 Sec. 2. Section 38-2402, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
6 2014, is amended to read:

38-2402 For purposes of the Nursing Home Administrator Practice Act
 and elsewhere in the Uniform Credentialing Act, unless the context
 otherwise requires, the definitions found in sections <u>38-2404 to 38-2414</u>
 <del>38-2403 to 38-2416</del> apply.

11 Sec. 3. Section 38-2408, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 12 amended to read:

13 38-2408 Core educational requirements means <u>education</u> courses 14 necessary for licensure as a nursing home administrator <u>as provided in</u> 15 <u>section 6 of this act and includes courses in patient care and services</u>, 16 <u>social services</u>, <u>financial management</u>, <u>administration</u>, <u>and rules</u>, 17 <u>regulations</u>, <u>and standards relating to the operation of a health care</u> 18 <u>facility</u>.

Sec. 4. Section 38-2412, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, isamended to read:

21 38-2412 Internship means that aspect of the educational program of 22 the associate degree in long-term care administration which allows for 23 practical experience in a nursing home and occurs under the supervision 24 of a certified preceptor.

Sec. 5. Section 38-2419, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
26 2014, is amended to read:

27 38-2419 (1) The department shall issue a license to an applicant who 28 submits (a) satisfactory evidence of completion of (i) an associate 29 degree which includes the core educational requirements and an 30 administrator-in-training program <u>or mentoring program</u> under a certified 31 preceptor<sub>7</sub> (ii) a degree or an advanced degree and a mentoring program

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under a certified preceptor, (iii) a nursing degree, previous work 1 2 experience in health care administration, and a mentoring program under a 3 certified preceptor, (iv) a degree or an advanced degree in health care 4 and previous work experience in health care administration, or (v) an 5 associate degree which includes the core educational requirements, previous work experience, and a mentoring program under a certified 6 7  $\frac{1}{1}$  preceptor, and (b) evidence of successful passage of the National Association of Boards of Examiners for Nursing Home Administration 8 9 written examination.

10 (2) The department shall license administrators in accordance with 11 the Nursing Home Administrator Practice Act and standards, rules, and 12 regulations adopted and promulgated by the department, with the 13 recommendation of the board. The license shall not be transferable or 14 assignable.

(3) Each administrator shall be responsible for and oversee the 15 16 operation of only one licensed facility or one integrated system, except 17 that an administrator may make application to the department for approval to be responsible for and oversee the operations of a maximum of three 18 19 licensed facilities if such facilities are located within two hours' travel time of each other or to act in the dual role of administrator and 20 department head but not in the dual role of administrator and director of 21 22 nursing. In reviewing the application, the department may consider the 23 proximity of the facilities and the number of licensed beds in each 24 facility. An administrator responsible for and overseeing the operations 25 of any integrated system is subject to disciplinary action against his or her license for any regulatory violations within each system. 26

Sec. 6. (1) The board shall determine the core educational
 requirements for licensure as a nursing home administrator pursuant to
 the standards established in this section.

30 (2) For applicants for an initial license on or after October 1,
 31 2015, the core educational requirements shall include a baccalaureate

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1 <u>degree from a postsecondary educational institution approved by the</u>
2 <u>board.</u>

3 (3) For applicants for an initial license on or after October 1,
4 2017, the core educational requirements shall include (a) courses in
5 resident-centered care, quality of life, human resources, finance,
6 environment, leadership, and management and (b) an administrator-in7 training program, an internship, or a mentoring program.

(4) For applicants for an initial license prior to October 1, 2017, 8 9 the core educational requirements shall include (a) courses in patient 10 care and services, social services, financial management, administration, and rules, regulations, and standards relating to the operation of a 11 health care facility and (b)(i) an associate degree, (ii) a degree or an 12 13 advanced degree from a postsecondary educational institution approved by 14 the board, (iii) a nursing degree or diploma in nursing from an accredited program of nursing approved by the Board of Nursing and 15 previous work experience in health care administration which includes at 16 17 least two years working full time as an administrator or director of nursing of a hospital with a long-term care unit or assisted-living 18 19 facility or director of nursing in a nursing home, (iv) a degree or an advanced degree in health care from a postsecondary educational 20 institution approved by the Board of Nursing Home Administration and 21 22 previous work experience in health care administration, in lieu of an 23 administrator-in-training program or mentoring program, which includes at 24 least two years working full time as an administrator or director of 25 nursing of a hospital with a long-term care unit or assisted-living facility or director of nursing in a nursing home, or (v) an associate 26 27 degree and previous work experience of at least two years working full 28 time in a nursing home or previous work experience in health care 29 administration.

30 Sec. 7. Section 38-2420, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
31 2014, is amended to read:

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1 38-2420 (1) Except as provided in subdivision (4)(b) (1)(a)(iv) of section 6 of this act <del>38-2419</del> and section 38-2426, in order for a person 2 to become licensed as a nursing home administrator, he or she shall 3 4 complete an administrator-in-training program or a mentoring program. The 5 administrator-in-training program shall occur in a nursing home under the direct supervision of a certified preceptor, and it may be gained as an 6 7 internship which is part of an approved associate degree. A mentoring program shall occur in a nursing home under the supervision of a 8 9 certified preceptor. The certified preceptor in a mentoring program need not be at such facility during the period of such supervision but shall 10 be available to assist with questions or problems as needed. A mentoring 11 program may be gained as an internship which is part of a degree or 12 13 advanced degree. A person in a mentoring program may apply for a provisional license as provided in section 38-2423. 14

(2) An applicant may begin his or her administrator-in-training or 15 16 mentoring program upon application to the department with the required fee, evidence that he or she has completed at least fifty percent of the 17 core educational requirements, and evidence of an agreement between the 18 certified preceptor and the applicant for at least six hundred forty 19 hours of training and experience, to be gained in not less than four 20 months. Such training shall occur in a Nebraska-licensed nursing home 21 22 under a certified preceptor.

23 (3) The certified preceptor shall submit a report to the department 24 by the fifth day of each month for the duration of the administrator-intraining or mentoring program, describing the nature and extent of 25 training completed to date. At the conclusion of the program, the 26 certified preceptor shall report to the department whether the applicant 27 has successfully completed the board's approved course for such program. 28 With the concurrence of the certified preceptor, the applicant may remain 29 in such program until successfully completed or may reapply to enter 30 31 another administrator-in-training or mentoring program.

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1 (4)(a) The administrator-in-training or mentoring program shall 2 occur under the supervision of a certified preceptor. An applicant to 3 become a certified preceptor shall (i) be currently licensed as a nursing 4 home administrator in the State of Nebraska, (ii) have three years of 5 experience as a nursing home administrator in the five years immediately 6 preceding certification, and (iii) complete a preceptor training course 7 approved by the board.

8 (b) All preceptor certificates shall expire on December 31 of every fourth year beginning December 31, 2000. Before acting on an application 9 for renewal, the board shall review the performance of the applicant. 10 Such include consideration of survey 11 review may and complaint information, student evaluations, and any other related information 12 deemed relevant by the board. The board may deny an application for 13 14 renewal upon a finding that the applicant's performance has been unsatisfactory based on such review. 15

Sec. 8. Section 38-2421, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

38-2421 The department may issue a license to any person who holds a
current nursing home administrator license from another jurisdiction and
is at least <u>twenty-one</u> nineteen years old.

21 Sec. 9. Section 38-2422, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 22 amended to read:

23 38-2422 Any person desiring to take the examination for a nursing 24 home administrator license may request to take the examination any time 25 after receiving notification of registration as an administrator-in-26 training<u>, an intern</u> or a person in a mentoring program, but the license 27 shall not be issued until the board receives documentation of completion 28 of the administrator-in-training <u>program</u>, <u>internship</u>, or mentoring 29 program and completion of all licensure requirements.
