- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education funds; to amend section 85-1920,
- 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 9-812, Revised
- 3 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014; to change provisions relating
- 4 to the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund and the Nebraska
- 5 Opportunity Grant Fund as prescribed; to harmonize provisions; and
- 6 to repeal the original sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 9-812, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

2 2014, is amended to read:

3 9-812 (1) All money received from the operation of lottery games conducted pursuant to the State Lottery Act in Nebraska shall be credited 4 to the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund, which fund is hereby created. 5 All payments of the costs of establishing and maintaining the lottery 6 7 games shall be made from the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund. In accordance with legislative appropriations, money for payments for 8 expenses of the division shall be transferred from the State Lottery 9 Operation Trust Fund to the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, which fund 10 is hereby created. All money necessary for the payment of lottery prizes 11 shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the 12 State Lottery Prize Trust Fund, which fund is hereby created. The amount 13 used for the payment of lottery prizes shall not be less than forty 14 percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold. 15

- (2) A portion of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund, the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund as provided in subsection (3) of this section. The dollar amount transferred pursuant to this subsection shall equal the greater of (a) the dollar amount transferred to the funds in fiscal year 2002-03 or (b) any amount which constitutes at least twenty-two percent and no more than twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis. To the extent that funds are available, the Tax Commissioner and director may authorize a transfer exceeding twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets sold on an annualized basis.
- 30 (3) Of the money available to be transferred to the Education 31 Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund, the Nebraska

- 1 Education Improvement Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the
- 2 Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund:
- 3 (a) The first five hundred thousand dollars shall be transferred to
- 4 the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in section
- 5 9-1006;
- 6 (b) Beginning July 1, 2016, nineteen and three-fourths forty-four
- 7 and one-half percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes
- 8 and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive
- 9 Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska Education
- 10 Improvement Fund;
- 11 (c) Through June 30, 2016, nineteen and three-fourths percent of the
- 12 money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and
- 13 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be
- 14 transferred to the Education Innovation Fund;
- 15 (d) <u>Twenty-four</u> <u>Through June 30, 2016, twenty-four</u> and three-fourths
- 16 percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating
- 17 expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance
- 18 Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund;
- 19 (e) Forty-four and one-half percent of the money remaining after the
- 20 payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the
- 21 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska
- 22 Environmental Trust Fund to be used as provided in the Nebraska
- 23 Environmental Trust Act;
- 24 (f) Ten percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes
- 25 and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive
- 26 Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska State Fair
- 27 Board if the most populous city within the county in which the fair is
- 28 located provides matching funds equivalent to ten percent of the funds
- 29 available for transfer. Such matching funds may be obtained from the city
- 30 and any other private or public entity, except that no portion of such
- 31 matching funds shall be provided by the state. If the Nebraska State Fair

- 1 ceases operations, ten percent of the money remaining after the payment
- 2 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the
- 3 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the General
- 4 Fund; and
- 5 (g) One percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes
- 6 and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive
- 7 Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers
- 8 Assistance Fund to be used as provided in section 9-1006.
- 9 (4)(a) The Education Innovation Fund is created. At least seventy-
- 10 five percent of the lottery proceeds allocated to the Education
- 11 Innovation Fund shall be available for disbursement.
- (b) For fiscal year 2013-14, the Education Innovation Fund shall be 12 13 allocated as follows: (i) The first one million dollars shall be transferred to the Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund to fund the 14 Excellence in Teaching Act; (ii) the next allocation shall be distributed 15 to local systems as grants for approved accelerated or differentiated 16 curriculum programs for students identified as learners with high ability 17 pursuant to section 79-1108.02 in an aggregated amount up to the amount 18 distributed in the prior fiscal year for such purposes increased by the 19 basic allowable growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (iii) up to the 20 next one hundred sixty thousand dollars shall be used by the State 21 Department of Education to implement section 79-759; (iv) the next one 22 million seven hundred fifty thousand dollars shall be allocated to early 23 24 childhood education grants awarded by the department pursuant to section 79-1103; (v) the next one million dollars shall be transferred to the 25 Early Childhood Education Endowment Cash Fund for use pursuant to section 26 79-1104.02; (vi) the next two hundred thousand dollars shall be used to 27 provide grants to establish bridge programs pursuant to sections 79-1189 28 to 79-1195; (vii) the next ten thousand dollars shall be used to fund the 29 Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children; 30

(viii) the next eighty-five thousand five hundred fifty dollars shall be

allocated to the State Department of Education for distribution pursuant to section 79-2306; and (ix) the amount remaining shall be allocated, after administrative expenses, for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337. No funds received as allocations from the Education Innovation Fund pursuant to this

subdivision may be obligated for payment to be made after June 30, 2016.

(c) For fiscal year 2014-15, the Education Innovation Fund shall be 7 allocated, after administrative expenses, as follows: (i) The first one 8 9 million two hundred thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund to fund the Excellence in Teaching Act; 10 (ii) the next allocation shall be distributed to local systems as grants 11 for approved accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs for 12 13 students identified as learners with high ability pursuant to section 79-1108.02 in an aggregated amount up to the amount distributed in the 14 prior fiscal year for such purposes increased by the basic allowable 15 16 growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (iii) the next one million eight hundred fifty thousand dollars shall be allocated to early childhood 17 education grants awarded by the State Department of Education pursuant to 18 section 79-1103; (iv) the next one million dollars shall be transferred 19 to the Early Childhood Education Endowment Cash Fund for use pursuant to 20 section 79-1104.02; (v) the next two hundred thousand dollars shall be 21 used to provide grants to establish bridge programs pursuant to sections 22 79-1189 to 79-1195; (vi) the next ten thousand dollars shall be used to 23 24 fund the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children; (vii) the next two million dollars shall be allocated for 25 distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 26 and 79-1337; (viii) the next one million dollars shall be transferred to 27 28 the School District Reorganization Fund; (ix) up to the next one hundred forty-five thousand dollars shall be used by the State Department of 29 Education to implement section 79-759; and (x) the next three hundred 30 thirty-five thousand dollars shall be allocated to local systems as 31

grants awarded by the State Department of Education to assist schools in 1 2 evaluating and improving career education programs to align such programs with the state's economic and workforce needs. Except for funds 3 4 transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund, the Early 5 Childhood Education Endowment Cash Fund, or the department for early childhood education grants pursuant to section 79-1103, no funds received 6 7 as allocations from the Education Innovation Fund pursuant to this subdivision may be obligated for payment to be made after June 30, 2016, 8 9 and such funds received as transfers or allocations from the Education 10 Innovation Fund that have not been used for their designated purpose as of such date shall be transferred to the Nebraska Education Improvement 11 Fund on or before August 1, 2016. 12

13 (d) For fiscal year 2015-16, the Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after administrative expenses, as follows: (i) The first one 14 million two hundred thousand dollars shall be transferred to the 15 Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund to fund the Excellence in Teaching Act; 16 (ii) the next allocation shall be distributed to local systems as grants 17 for approved accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs for 18 students identified as learners with high ability pursuant to section 19 79-1108.02 in an aggregated amount up to the amount distributed in the 20 prior fiscal year for such purposes increased by the basic allowable 21 22 growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (iii) the next one million nine hundred fifty thousand dollars shall be allocated to early childhood 23 24 education grants awarded by the State Department of Education pursuant to 25 section 79-1103; (iv) the next one million dollars shall be transferred to the Early Childhood Education Endowment Cash Fund for use pursuant to 26 section 79-1104.02; (v) the next ten thousand dollars shall be used to 27 28 fund the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children; (vi) the next two million five hundred thousand dollars shall 29 be allocated for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to 30 sections 79-1336 and 79-1337; (vii) the next one million dollars shall be 31

transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund; (viii) up to the 1 next one hundred forty-five thousand dollars shall be used by the State 2 Department of Education to implement section 79-759; and (ix) of the 3 amount remaining, (A) three million dollars shall be retained in the 4 5 Education Innovation Fund to transfer to the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund on June 30, 2016, and (B) the remaining amount shall be 6 allocated to local systems as grants awarded by the State Department of 7 Education to assist schools in evaluating and improving career education 8 9 programs to align such programs with the state's economic and workforce needs. Except for funds transferred to the School District Reorganization 10 the Early Childhood Education Endowment Cash Fund, 11 Fund, the department for early childhood education grants pursuant to section 12 13 79-1103, no funds received as allocations from the Education Innovation 14 Fund pursuant to this subdivision may be obligated for payment to be made after June 30, 2016, and such funds received as transfers or allocations 15 from the Education Innovation Fund that have not been used for their 16 17 designated purpose as of such date shall be transferred to the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund on or before August 1, 2016.

- 19 (e) The Education Innovation Fund terminates on June 30, 2016. Any money in the fund on such date shall be transferred to the Nebraska 20 Education Improvement Fund on such date. 21
- 22 (5) The Nebraska Education Improvement Fund is created. The fund shall consist of money transferred pursuant to subsections (3) and (4) of 23 24 this section, money transferred pursuant to section 85-1920, and any other funds appropriated by the Legislature. Any money in the fund 25 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment 26 officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska 27 State Funds Investment Act. 28
- 29 (6) Any money in the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund, the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, the State Lottery Prize Trust Fund, or the 30 Education Innovation Fund available for investment shall be invested by 31

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1 the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion

- 2 Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
- 3 (7) Unclaimed prize money on a winning lottery ticket shall be
- 4 retained for a period of time prescribed by rules and regulations. If no
- 5 claim is made within such period, the prize money shall be used at the
- 6 discretion of the Tax Commissioner for any of the purposes prescribed in
- 7 this section.
- 8 Sec. 2. Section 85-1920, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 9 amended to read:
- 10 85-1920 The Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund is created. Money in the
- 11 fund shall include amounts transferred from the State Lottery Operation
- 12 Trust Fund pursuant to section 9-812 until June 30, 2016. All amounts
- 13 accruing to the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund shall be used to carry
- 14 out the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Act. Any money in the fund available
- 15 for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant
- 16 to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds
- 17 Investment Act.
- 18 The Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund terminates on June 30, 2016. Any
- 19 money in the fund on such date shall be transferred to the Nebraska
- 20 Education Improvement Fund on such date.
- 21 Sec. 3. Original section 85-1920, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 22 Nebraska, and section 9-812, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 23 2014, are repealed.
