- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to amend sections 79-8,134,
- 2 79-8,137, 79-8,137.02, 79-8,137.03, 79-8,137.04, and 79-8,137.05,
- 3 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change provisions relating
- 4 to the Attracting Excellence to Teaching Program and the Enhancing
- 5 Excellence in Teaching Program; to harmonize provisions; and to
- 6 repeal the original sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 79-8,134, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,

- 3 79-8,134 The purposes of the Attracting Excellence to Teaching
- 4 Program are to:
- 5 (1) Attract outstanding students to major in shortage areas at the
- 6 teacher education programs of Nebraska's postsecondary educational
- 7 institutions;
- 8 (2) Retain resident students and graduates as teachers in the
- 9 accredited school districts, educational services units, and private
- 10 schools or approved public and private schools of Nebraska; and
- 11 (3) Establish a loan contract that requires a borrower to obtain
- 12 employment as a teacher in this state after graduation.
- Sec. 2. Section 79-8,137, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 14 amended to read:
- 15 79-8,137 (1)(a) Prior to receiving any money from a loan pursuant to
- 16 the Attracting Excellence to Teaching Program, an eligible student shall
- 17 enter into a contract with the department. Such contract shall provide
- 18 notice to the eligible student that funding for loans pursuant to the
- 19 Attracting Excellence to Teaching Program terminates on June 30, 2016.
- 20 Such contract shall be exempt from the requirements of sections 73-501 to
- 21 73-510.
- 22 (b) For eligible students who applied for the first time prior to
- 23 April 23, 2009, the contract shall require that if (i) the borrower is
- 24 not employed as a teacher in Nebraska for a time period equal to the
- 25 number of years required for loan forgiveness pursuant to subsection (2)
- 26 of this section and is not enrolled as a full-time student in a graduate
- 27 program within six months after obtaining an undergraduate degree for
- 28 which a loan from the program was obtained or (ii) the borrower does not
- 29 complete the requirements for graduation within five consecutive years
- 30 after receiving the initial loan under the program, then the loan must be
- 31 repaid, with interest at the rate fixed pursuant to section 45-103

1 accruing as of the date the borrower signed the contract, and an

- 2 appropriate penalty as determined by the department may be assessed. If a
- 3 borrower fails to remain enrolled at an eligible institution or otherwise
- 4 fails to meet the requirements of an eligible student, repayment of the
- 5 loan shall commence within six months after such change in eligibility.
- 6 The State Board of Education may by rules and regulations provide for
- 7 exceptions to the conditions of repayment pursuant to this subdivision
- 8 based upon mitigating circumstances.
- 9 (c) For eligible students who apply for the first time on or after April 23, 2009, the contract shall require that if (i) the borrower is 10 not employed as a full-time teacher teaching in an approved or accredited 11 school in Nebraska and teaching at least a portion of the time in the 12 shortage area for which the loan was received for a time period equal to 13 the number of years required for loan forgiveness pursuant to subsection 14 (3) of this section or and is not enrolled as a full-time student in a 15 16 graduate program within six months after obtaining an undergraduate degree for which a loan from the program was obtained or (ii) the 17 borrower does not complete the requirements for graduation within five 18 consecutive years after receiving the initial loan under the program, 19 then the loan shall be repaid with interest at the rate fixed pursuant to 20 section 45-103 accruing as of the date the borrower signed the contract 21 and actual collection costs as determined by the department. If a 22 23 borrower fails to remain enrolled at an eligible institution or otherwise fails to continue to be an eligible student, repayment of the loan shall 24 25 commence within six months after such change in eligibility. The State Board of Education may by rule and regulation provide for exceptions to 26 the conditions of repayment pursuant to this subdivision based upon 27 28 mitigating circumstances.
- (2) If the borrower applied for the first time prior to April 23, 2009, and (a) successfully completes the teacher education program and becomes certified pursuant to sections 79-806 to 79-815, (b) becomes

- 5 is amended to read:
- 6 79-8,137.03 (1) The department shall administer the Enhancing
- 7 Excellence in Teaching Program either directly or by contracting with
- 8 public or private entities.
- 9 (2) To be eligible for the program, an eligible student shall:
- 10 (a) Agree to complete an eligible graduate program at an eligible
- 11 institution and to complete the major on which the applicant's
- 12 eligibility is based as determined by the department; and
- 13 (b) Commit to teach in an accredited or approved public or private
- 14 school in Nebraska upon successful completion of the eligible graduate
- 15 program for which the applicant is applying to the Enhancing Excellence
- 16 in Teaching Program and to maintaining certification pursuant to sections

- 18 (3) Eligible students may apply on an annual basis for loans in an

If a borrower fails to remain enrolled at an eligible institution or 10 otherwise fails to meet the requirements of an eligible student, 11 repayment of the loan shall commence within six months after such change 12 in eligibility. The State Board of Education may by rules and regulations 13 14 provide for exceptions to the conditions of repayment pursuant to this subsection based upon mitigating circumstances. 15

(2)(a) If the borrower ( $\underline{i}$  a) successfully completes the eligible graduate program and major for which the borrower is receiving a forgivable loan pursuant to the Enhancing Excellence in Teaching Program and maintains certification pursuant to sections 79-806 to 79-815, ( $\underline{i}\underline{i}$   $\underline{b}$ ) maintains employment as a teacher in an approved or accredited school in this state, and ( $\underline{i}\underline{i}\underline{i}$   $\underline{c}$ ) otherwise meets the requirements of the contract, payments shall be suspended for the number of years that the borrower is required to remain employed as a teacher in this state under the contract.

- 12 forgiven in an amount equal to one thousand five hundred dollars, except
- 13 that if the borrower teaches full-time in a school district that is in a
- 14 <u>local system classified as very sparse as defined in section 79-1003,</u>
- 15 teaches in a school building in which at least forty percent of the
- 16 formula students are poverty students as defined in section 79-1003, or
- 17 teaches in an accredited private school or educational service unit or an
- 18 approved private school in Nebraska in which at least forty percent of
- 19 the enrolled students qualified for free lunches as determined by the
- 20 most recent data available from the department, payments shall be
- 21 <u>forgiven each year in an amount equal to one thousand five hundred</u>
- 22 <u>dollars for the first year and three thousand dollars for each year</u>

- Sec. 6. Section 79-8,137.05, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
- 25 is amended to read:
- 26 79-8,137.05 (1) The Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund is created. The
- 27 fund shall consist of appropriations by the Legislature, transfers
- 28 pursuant to section 9-812, and loan repayments, penalties, and interest
- 29 payments received in the course of administering the Attracting
- 30 Excellence to Teaching Program and the Enhancing Excellence in Teaching
- 31 Program.

- 1 (2) For all fiscal years except fiscal years 2011-12 and 2012-13, 2 the department shall allocate on an annual basis up to four hundred thousand dollars in the aggregate of the funds to be distributed for the 3 4 Attracting Excellence to Teaching Program to all eligible institutions 5 according to the distribution formula as determined by rule and regulation. The eligible institutions shall act as agents of the 6 7 department in the distribution of the funds for the Attracting Excellence to Teaching Program to eligible students. The department shall allocate 8 9 on an annual basis up to eight hundred thousand dollars of the remaining 10 available funds to shall be distributed by the department to eligible 11 students for the Enhancing Excellence in Teaching Program. Funding amounts granted in excess of one million two hundred thousand dollars 12 13 shall be evenly divided for distribution between the two programs.
- 14 (3) For fiscal years 2011-12 and 2012-13, the department shall 15 allocate on an annual basis funds to be distributed for the Attracting Excellence to Teaching Program to all eligible institutions receiving 16 17 applications from eligible students for loans to be received during such 18 fiscal years. The distribution for each of fiscal years 2011-12 and 19 2012-13 shall be proportional based on the amounts applied for by 20 eligible students at each institution, except that no more than one 21 hundred percent of such amounts shall be distributed. The eligible 22 institutions shall act as agents of the department in the distribution of 23 the funds for the Attracting Excellence to Teaching Program to eligible 24 students.
- 25  $(\underline{3} \ 4)$  Any money remaining in the fund on August 1, 2016, shall be 26 transferred to the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund on such date.
- (4 5) Any money in the Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund available for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
