- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Vital Statistics Act; to amend sections
- 2 71-601 and 71-601.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to
- define a term; to provide for certificates of nonviable birth as
- 4 prescribed; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original
- 5 sections.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 71-601, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 71-601 Sections 71-601 to 71-649 and section 3 of this act shall be
- 4 known and may be cited as the Vital Statistics Act.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 71-601.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 6 amended to read:
- 7 71-601.01 For purposes of the Vital Statistics Act:
- 8 (1) Abstract of marriage means a certified document that summarizes
- 9 the facts of marriage, including, but not limited to, the name of the
- 10 bride and groom, the date of the marriage, the place of the marriage, and
- 11 the name of the office filing the original marriage license. An abstract
- 12 of marriage does not include signatures;
- 13 (2) Certificate means the record of a vital event;
- 14 (3) Certification means the process of recording, filing, amending,
- 15 or preserving a certificate, which process may be by any means,
- 16 including, but not limited to, microfilm, electronic, imaging
- 17 photographic, typewritten, or other means designated by the department;
- 18 and
- 19 (4) Department means the Department of Health and Human Services \pm
- 20 <u>and</u> -
- 21 (5) Nonviable birth means an unintentional, spontaneous fetal demise
- 22 occurring prior to the twentieth week of gestation during a pregnancy
- 23 that has been verified by a health care practitioner.
- 24 Sec. 3. (1) A health care practitioner licensed pursuant to the
- 25 Uniform Credentialing Act who attends or diagnoses a nonviable birth or a
- 26 <u>health care facility licensed pursuant to the Health Care Facility</u>
- 27 <u>Licensure Act at which a nonviable birth occurs shall advise a patient</u>
- 28 who experiences a nonviable birth that the patient may request a
- 29 certificate of nonviable birth as provided in this section and, upon
- 30 request by the patient, shall provide a letter certifying the nonviable
- 31 birth to the patient.

- 1 (2) Upon the request of the patient and submission of the letter,
- 2 the department shall issue a certificate of nonviable birth within sixty
- 3 <u>days after receipt of such request. The department shall charge a fee not</u>
- 4 to exceed its actual cost for issuing the certificate.
- 5 (3)(a) The certificate of nonviable birth shall contain the name of
- 6 the fetus and the gender if known. If the name is not furnished by the
- 7 patient, the department shall fill in the certificate with the name Baby
- 8 Boy or Baby Girl and the last name of the patient, and if the gender of
- 9 the child is also unknown, the department shall fill in the certificate
- 10 of nonviable birth with the name Baby and the last name of the patient.
- 11 <u>(b) The following statement shall appear on the front of the</u>
- 12 certificate: This certificate is not proof of a live birth.
- 13 <u>(4) The department shall not register the birth associated with a</u>
- 14 certificate issued under this section or use it to calculate live birth
- 15 statistics. The certificate is commemorative in nature and has no legal
- 16 effect.
- 17 (5) A certificate issued under this section shall not be used to
- 18 establish, bring, or support a civil cause of action seeking damages
- 19 <u>against any person or entity for bodily injury, personal injury, or</u>
- 20 wrongful death for a nonviable birth.
