- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to public health and welfare; to amend section
- 2 71-8509, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016; to change
- 3 provisions relating to telehealth services for children's behavioral
- 4 health; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 71-8509, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 2 2016, is amended to read:
- 3 71-8509 (1) The Department of Health and Human Services shall adopt
- 4 and promulgate rules and regulations providing for telehealth services
- 5 for children's behavioral health. Such rules and regulations relate
- 6 specifically to children's behavioral health and are in addition to the
- 7 Nebraska Telehealth Act.
- 8 For purposes of sections 71-8509 to 71-8512, child means a person
- 9 under nineteen years of age.
- 10 (2) The rules and regulations required pursuant to subsection (1) of
- 11 this section shall include, but not be limited to:
- 12 (a) An appropriately trained staff member or employee familiar with
- 13 the child's treatment plan or familiar with the child shall be
- 14 immediately available in person to the child receiving a telehealth
- 15 behavioral health service in order to attend to any urgent situation or
- 16 emergency that may occur during provision of such service. This
- 17 requirement may be waived by the child's parent or legal guardian; and
- 18 (b) In cases in which there is a threat that the child may harm
- 19 himself or herself or others, before an initial telehealth service the
- 20 health care practitioner shall work with the child and his or her parent
- 21 or guardian to develop a safety plan. Such plan shall document actions
- 22 the child, the health care practitioner, and the parent or guardian will
- 23 take in the event of an emergency or urgent situation occurring during or
- 24 after the telehealth session. Such plan may include having a staff member
- 25 or employee familiar with the child's treatment plan immediately
- 26 available in person to the child, if such measures are deemed necessary
- 27 by the team developing the safety plan. ; and
- 28 (c) Services provided by means of telecommunications technology,
- 29 other than telehealth behavioral health services received by a child, are
- 30 not covered if the child has access to a comparable service within thirty
- 31 miles of his or her place of residence.
