- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Political Accountability and 2 Disclosure Act; to amend section 49-1403, Reissue Revised Statutes 3 of Nebraska, section 49-1463.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative 4 Supplement, 2016, and section 49-1401, Revised Statutes Supplement, 5 2017; to define require reporting term; to regarding 6 electioneering communications; to provide for late filing fees; to 7 provide a penalty; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the

1 Section 1. Section 49-1401, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017, is

- 3 49-1401 Sections 49-1401 to 49-14,142 <u>and sections 3 and 5 of this</u>
- 4 act shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Political
- 5 Accountability and Disclosure Act.
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 49-1403, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 7 amended to read:
- 8 49-1403 For purposes of the Nebraska Political Accountability and
- 9 Disclosure Act, unless the context otherwise requires, the definitions
- 10 found in sections 49-1404 to 49-1444 and section 3 of this act shall be
- 11 used.
- 12 Sec. 3. (1) Electioneering communication means any communication
- 13 which:
- 14 <u>(a) Refers to a clearly identified candidate;</u>
- 15 (b) Is publicly distributed in the sixty days immediately preceding
- 16 an election for the office sought by the clearly identified candidate;
- 17 and
- 18 (c) Is directed to the electorate of the office sought by the
- 19 clearly identified candidate.
- 20 (2) Electioneering communication does not include:
- 21 <u>(a) A contribution or expenditure;</u>
- 22 (b) A communication by a television station, radio station,
- 23 newspaper, magazine, or other periodical or publication for any news
- 24 story, commentary, or editorial in support of or opposition to a
- 25 candidate for elective office;
- 26 (c) A candidate debate or forum or a communication which gives
- 27 <u>notice of a candidate debate or forum;</u>
- 28 <u>(d) A communication while the Legislature is in session about</u>
- 29 <u>specifically named pending legislation;</u>
- 30 (e) The posting on the Internet or other publication or distribution
- 31 of a voter guide;

- 1 (f) A communication by a membership organization to one or more of
- 2 <u>the recognized members of the membership organization if any one or more</u>
- 3 <u>of the following applies:</u>
- 4 (i) The member has submitted an email to the membership organization
- 5 indicating an intent to be a member;
- 6 (ii) The member has submitted a written letter or other written
- 7 statement to the membership organization indicating an intent to be a
- 8 member; or
- 9 (iii) The member has paid dues to the membership organization; or
- 10 (g) An advertisement which is for the sole purpose of the marketing
- 11 <u>or sale of goods or services, which includes a reference to a candidate</u>
- 12 <u>with the permission of the candidate, and which does not reference the</u>
- 13 <u>candidacy of the candidate.</u>
- 14 (3) For purposes of this section:
- 15 (a) Clearly identified candidate means the candidate whose name,
- 16 nickname, photograph, or drawing appears in the communication or whose
- 17 <u>identity is otherwise apparent in the communication through an</u>
- 18 unambiguous reference or through an unambiguous reference to the
- 19 candidate's status as a candidate; and
- 20 <u>(b) Voter guide means a document or other compilation of the</u>
- 21 responses of candidates to a survey or questionnaire if all known
- 22 candidates seeking election to the same office are given the opportunity
- 23 to respond to the survey or questionnaire, all responses received from
- 24 candidates seeking election to the same office by the deadline designated
- 25 in or with the survey or questionnaire are included in the document or
- 26 <u>compilation</u>, and the document or other compilation does not express
- 27 <u>support for or opposition to the election of any candidate.</u>
- 28 Sec. 4. Section 49-1463.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 29 2016, is amended to read:
- 30 49-1463.01 (1) A person required to pay a late filing fee imposed
- 31 under section 49-1449, 49-1458, 49-1463, 49-1467, 49-1469.08, 49-1478.01,

- 1 or 49-1479.01 or section 5 of this act may apply to the commission for
- 2 relief. The commission by order may reduce the amount of a late filing
- 3 fee imposed and waive any or all of the interest due on the fee upon a
- 4 showing by such person that (a) the circumstances indicate no intent to
- 5 file late, (b) the person has not been required to pay late filing fees
- 6 for two years prior to the time the filing was due, (c) the late filing
- 7 shows that less than five thousand dollars was raised, received, or
- 8 expended during the reporting period, and (d) a reduction of the late
- 9 fees and waiver of interest would not frustrate the purposes of the
- 10 Nebraska Political Accountability and Disclosure Act.
- 11 (2) A person required to pay a late filing fee imposed for failure
- 12 to file a statement of exemption under subsection (2) of section 49-1459
- 13 may apply to the commission for relief. The commission by order may
- 14 reduce or waive the late filing fee and waive any or all of the interest
- due on the fee, and the person shall not be required to make a showing as
- 16 provided by subsection (1) of this section.
- 17 Sec. 5. (1) Any person who makes an electioneering communication in
- 18 an amount of more than two hundred fifty dollars shall, within two days,
- 19 <u>file a report of the electioneering communication with the commission.</u>
- 20 (2) The report shall be made on an electioneering communication
- 21 report form provided by the commission and shall include:
- 22 (a) The date of the electioneering communication;
- 23 (b) A brief description of the nature of the electioneering
- 24 <u>communication and the means of communication;</u>
- 25 (c) The amount disbursed for the electioneering communication;
- 26 (d) The name and address of the person to whom such amount was paid;
- 27 <u>(e) The name and address of the person filing the report; and</u>
- 28 <u>(f) The name of the candidate who is the subject of the</u>
- 29 <u>electioneering communication.</u>
- 30 (3) Any person who fails to file a report of an electioneering
- 31 communication with the commission shall pay to the commission a late

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1 filing fee of twenty-five dollars for each day the statement remains not

- 2 <u>filed in violation of this section, not to exceed seven hundred fifty</u>
- 3 <u>dollars</u>.
- 4 (4) Any person who violates this section shall be guilty of a Class
- 5 <u>IV misdemeanor.</u>
- 6 Sec. 6. Original section 49-1403, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 7 Nebraska, section 49-1463.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 8 2016, and section 49-1401, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017, are
