- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to health occupations and professions; to
- 2 amend sections 38-2047 and 38-2315, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 3 Nebraska; to authorize physician assistants and nurse practitioners
- 4 to render expert opinions as prescribed; and to repeal the original
- 5 sections.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 38-2047, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 38-2047 (1) A physician assistant may perform medical services that
- 4 (a) are delegated by and provided under the supervision of a licensed
- 5 physician, (b) are appropriate to the level of competence of the
- 6 physician assistant, (c) form a component of the supervising physician's
- 7 scope of practice, and (d) are not otherwise prohibited by law.
- 8 (2) A physician assistant shall be considered an agent of his or her
- 9 supervising physician in the performance of practice-related activities
- 10 delegated by the supervising physician, including, but not limited to,
- 11 ordering diagnostic, therapeutic, and other medical services.
- 12 (3) Each physician assistant and his or her supervising physician
- 13 shall be responsible to ensure that (a) the scope of practice of the
- 14 physician assistant is identified, (b) the delegation of medical tasks is
- 15 appropriate to the level of competence of the physician assistant, (c)
- 16 the relationship of and access to the supervising physician is defined,
- 17 and (d) a process for evaluation of the performance of the physician
- 18 assistant is established.
- 19 (4) A physician assistant may pronounce death and may complete and
- 20 sign death certificates and any other forms if such acts are within the
- 21 scope of practice of the physician assistant, are delegated by his or her
- 22 supervising physician, and are not otherwise prohibited by law.
- 23 (5) In order for a physician assistant to practice in a hospital,
- 24 (a) his or her supervising physician shall be a member of the medical
- 25 staff of the hospital, (b) the physician assistant shall be approved by
- 26 the governing board of the hospital, and (c) the physician assistant
- 27 shall comply with applicable hospital policies, including, but not
- 28 limited to, reasonable requirements that the physician assistant and the
- 29 supervising physician maintain professional liability insurance with such
- 30 coverage and limits as established by the governing board of the
- 31 hospital.

- 1 (6) For physician assistants with less than two years of experience,
- 2 the department, with the recommendation of the board, shall adopt and
- 3 promulgate rules and regulations establishing minimum requirements for
- 4 the personal presence of the supervising physician, stated in hours or
- 5 percentage of practice time, and may provide different minimum
- 6 requirements for the personal presence of the supervising physician based
- 7 on the geographic location of the supervising physician's primary and
- 8 other practice sites and other factors the board deems relevant.
- 9 (7) A physician assistant may render services in a setting
- 10 geographically remote from the supervising physician, except that a
- 11 physician assistant with less than two years of experience shall comply
- 12 with standards of supervision established in rules and regulations
- 13 adopted and promulgated under the Medicine and Surgery Practice Act. The
- 14 board may consider an application for waiver of the standards and may
- 15 waive the standards upon a showing of good cause by the supervising
- 16 physician. The department may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations
- 17 establishing minimum requirements for such waivers.
- 18 <u>(8) A physician assistant may render expert opinions on matters</u>
- 19 within his or her scope of practice.
- Sec. 2. Section 38-2315, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 21 amended to read:
- 22 38-2315 (1) A nurse practitioner may provide health care services
- 23 within specialty areas. A nurse practitioner shall function by
- 24 establishing collaborative, consultative, and referral networks as
- 25 appropriate with other health care professionals. Patients who require
- 26 care beyond the scope of practice of a nurse practitioner shall be
- 27 referred to an appropriate health care provider.
- 28 (2) Nurse practitioner practice means health promotion, health
- 29 supervision, illness prevention and diagnosis, treatment, and management
- 30 of common health problems and acute and chronic conditions, including:
- 31 (a) Assessing patients, ordering diagnostic tests and therapeutic

1 treatments, synthesizing and analyzing data, and applying advanced

- 2 nursing principles;
- 3 (b) Dispensing, incident to practice only, sample medications which
- 4 are provided by the manufacturer and are provided at no charge to the
- 5 patient; and
- 6 (c) Prescribing therapeutic measures and medications relating to
- 7 health conditions within the scope of practice.
- 8 (3) A nurse practitioner who has proof of a current certification
- 9 from an approved certification program in a psychiatric or mental health
- 10 specialty may manage the care of patients committed under the Nebraska
- 11 Mental Health Commitment Act. Patients who require care beyond the scope
- 12 of practice of a nurse practitioner who has proof of a current
- 13 certification from an approved certification program in a psychiatric or
- 14 mental health specialty shall be referred to an appropriate health care
- 15 provider.
- 16 (4) A nurse practitioner may pronounce death and may complete and
- 17 sign death certificates and any other forms if such acts are within the
- 18 scope of practice of the nurse practitioner and are not otherwise
- 19 prohibited by law_and may render expert opinions on matters within his or
- 20 her scope of practice.
- 21 Sec. 3. Original sections 38-2047 and 38-2315, Reissue Revised
- 22 Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
