The \$10 million in revenue is showing the allocated ARPA appropriation and not an additional source of federal funding. The maximum funding available under the federal Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund is \$1.04 billion, of which only \$520 million is currently available. Appropriation of these funds must be balanced in aggregate in order to avoid over obligation. Technical Note: The language in LB 1160 does not provide the level of detail necessary to enact the appropriation intended.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB1160 is appropriating \$10,000,000 from federal ARPA Funds for FY2022-23 to the Department of Environment and Energy to award grants for small and rural communities to install reverse osmosis systems in community water systems and private wells.

Section 1(2)(b) states that any grant awarded pursuant to this section shall be coordinated and administered by the Department of Environment and Energy in compliance with the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. NDEE estimates there would be between 500 to 1,300 private wells and zero to five community applicants. It would take two full-time FTEs to establish a program and maintain the program. NDEE has prepared this fiscal note assuming LB1160 intends to pay the department's administrative costs from the appropriated \$10 million federal ARPA Funds. If that is not accurate, NDEE recommends clarifying language be added to the bill to specify how NDEE costs will be covered. Currently this activity is not eligible under other federal funds.
