Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB717 increases the Line of Duty compensation amount from fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) starting in calendar year 2022. The fiscal impact per year is estimated to be \$600,000 or more plus any future increases based on the Consumer Price Index. This estimate is based on calculations performed using assumptions derived from data on the Officer Down Memorial website, however the exact impact is unknown (see attached). Such claims would be paid by General Funds. There is no requested increase by Risk Management for General Funds currently. The current process requires that a claim be made to Risk Management, and if approved by the Claims Board, is presented to the Legislature as part of the annual Claims Bill. Appropriation would be provided in the approved Claims Bill.

Explanation of Estimate:						

LB 717 increases the Line of Duty compensation amount from fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) starting in calendar year 2022.

From 2015 to 2021 there has been, on average, according to the Officer Down Memorial website, one law enforcement officer killed in the line of duty each year in the State of Nebraska; and on-average, according to the Fire Fighters Fatalities in the United States website, one firefighter killed in the line of duty each year in the State of Nebraska. For Emergency Medical Services the fatality rate is similar to both police and fire fighters according to the National Library of Medicine website. Based on this historical data three to five deaths per year are estimated.

Assuming a minimum of three deaths per year, the proposed legislation would increase the expenditure by $$600,000 (3 \times an additional $200,000 per claim = $600,000)$.

In addition, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) which will be added each year starting in 2023 will be higher. For example, a claim with a CPI increase of 5% at the current compensation rate of \$50,000 would be \$52,500, an increase of \$2,500 ($$50,000 \times 5\% = $2,500$). The same claim at the proposed compensation rate of \$250,000 would increase by \$12,500 ($250,000 \times 5\% = $12,500$). The estimated increase could be \$30,000 (3×30) an additional \$10,000 per claim = \$30,000)

The fiscal impact per year is estimated to be \$600,000 or more plus any future increases based on the Consumer Price Index, however the exact impact is unknown. Such claims would be paid by General Funds. There is no requested increase by Risk Management for General Funds currently. The current process requires that a claim be made to Risk Management, and if approved by the Claims Board is presented to the Legislature as part of the annual Claims Bill. Appropriation would be provided in the approved Claims Bill.
