- Sec. 65. Section 71-1797, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 2
- 3 amended to read:
- 4 71-1797 The Legislature finds that it is imperative that the State
- of Nebraska protect its investment and the progress made in its efforts 5
- to alleviate the nursing shortage which exists. The Legislature also 6
- finds that the Nebraska Center for Nursing will provide the appropriate 7
- means to do so. It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate funds 8
- 9 necessary for the center to carry out the Nebraska Center for Nursing
- Act, including, but not limited to, (1) administrative costs incurred by 10
- the Department of Health and Human Services to expand clinical training 11
- 12 sites as provided in subsection (3) of section 71-1798 and (2) funds for
- such expansion of clinical training sites in the amount of three million 13
- dollars from the General Fund for fiscal year 2023-24 and three million 14
- dollars from the General Fund for fiscal year 2024-25. 15
- Sec. 66. Section 71-1798, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 16
- amended to read: 17
- (1) The Nebraska Center for Nursing is established. The 18
- 19 center shall address issues of supply and demand for nurses, including
- issues of recruitment, retention, and utilization of nurses. 20
- Legislature finds that the center will repay the state's investment by 21
- providing an ongoing strategy for the allocation of the state's resources 22
- directed towards nursing. 23
- (2) The primary goals for the center are: 24
- (a) (1) To develop a strategic statewide plan to alleviate the 25
- nursing shortage in Nebraska by: 26

- 1 (i) (a) Establishing and maintaining a database on nursing supply
- 2 and demand in Nebraska, including current supply and demand and future
- 3 projections; and
- 4 (ii) (b) Selecting priorities from the plan to be addressed;
- (b) (2) To convene various groups representative of nurses, other
- 6 health care providers, business and industry, consumers, legislators, and
- 7 educators to:
- 8 (i) (a) Review and comment on data analysis prepared for the center;
- 9 (ii) (b) Recommend systemic changes, including strategies for
- 10 implementation of recommended changes; and
- 11 (<u>iii)</u> (c) Evaluate and report the results of these efforts to the
- 12 Legislature and the public; and
- 13 (c) To enhance and promote recognition, reward, and renewal
- 14 activities for nurses by:
- 15 (i) (a) Proposing and creating recognition, reward, and renewal
- 16 activities; and
- 17 <u>(ii)</u> Promoting media and positive image-building efforts for
- 18 nursing.
- 19 (3) After consultation with a statewide association representing
- 20 hospitals and health systems that provide clinical nursing opportunities,
- 21 <u>the Nebraska Center for Nursing Board shall provide for the expansion of</u>
- 22 <u>clinical training sites for nurses throughout the state, giving</u>
- 23 preference to areas that have lower numbers of registered nurses per
- 24 capita compared to the state average, and shall provide for the
- 25 development of programs that:
- 26 (a) Incentivize clinical nurses to become clinical nurse faculty;
- 27 <u>(b) Incentivize nurse faculty to partner with staff nurses in the</u>
- 28 development of clinical nurse faculty;
- 29 (c) Expand simulation training for nurse clinical education; and
- 30 <u>(d) Incentivize hospital facilities to support the center in</u>
- 31 <u>carrying out this subsection.</u>

2. Correct the operative date and repealer sections so that the

- 2 sections added by this amendment become operative three calendar months
- 3 after the adjournment of this legislative session.
- 4 3. Renumber the remaining sections accordingly.
