- (2) Distributions to assist municipalities with the cost 25
- 26 constructing, upgrading, developing, and replacing sewer infrastructure
- 27 facilities as part of a combined sewer overflow project shall be based on
- a demonstration of need and shall equal ten percent of the total annual 28
- 29 appropriation to the Water Sustainability Fund if (a) applicants have
- 30 applied for such funding as required under section 2-1509 and (b) any
- such application has been recommended for further consideration by the 31

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- director and is subsequently approved for allocation by the commission 1

- 12 commission shall, when ranking and scoring applications for funding,
- prioritize projects for drinking water improvements for any federally 13
- 14 recognized Indian tribe whose drinking water is under a no-drink order
- 15 from the United States Environmental Protection Agency.
- (4) When the commission has approved an allocation of funds to a 16
- program, project, or activity, the Department of Natural Resources shall 17
- establish a subaccount in the Water Sustainability Fund and credit the 18
- entire amount of the allocation to the subaccount. Individual subaccounts 19
