- Compensation Act, a claim for the compensation shall must be filed with 5
- the Risk Manager within three years one year after the date of death of 6
- the public safety officer who was killed in the line of duty. Such claim 7
- shall be on a form prescribed by the Risk Manager and shall include: 8
- 9 (a) The name, address, and title or position of the public safety
- officer who was killed in the line of duty; 10
- (b) A copy of the form filed in accordance with subsection (4) of 11
- section 81-8,317, if any. If no such form has been filed, the claim shall 12
- include the name and address of the person or persons to whom 13
- compensation is payable under subdivision (3)(b) of section 81-8,317; 14
- (c) A sworn statement providing a full factual account of the 15
- circumstances resulting in or the course of events causing the death of 16
- the public safety officer; and 17
- (d) Such other information as the Risk Manager reasonably requires. 18
- 19 (2) The Risk Manager shall send written notice to all claimants
- within two weeks after the initiation of a claim indicating whether or 20
- not the claim is complete. For purposes of this subsection, a claim is 21
- complete if a claimant has submitted to the Risk Manager all documents 22
- and information required under subsection (1) of this section. If a claim 23
- is incomplete, the Risk Manager shall include in the written notice a 24
- list of the documents or information which the claimant must submit in 25
- order for the claim to be complete. If a claim is complete, the State 26

Claims Board shall make an investigation of the claim shall be made in 1 2 the manner provided in the State Tort Miscellaneous Claims Act\_in 3 accordance with section 81-8,212. Upon completion of such investigation, and no later than one hundred eighty forty-five days after receipt of a 4 5 complete claim, the State Claims Board shall approve or deny such claim 6 in accordance with section 81-8,300 and the Risk Manager shall send 7 written notice to the claimant stating whether the claim has been 8 approved or denied. If a claim is denied, the notice shall include the 9 reason or reasons for the denial. If a claimant is dissatisfied with a denial, he or she may file an application for review with the <u>district</u> 10 11 court for Lancaster County Risk Manager in accordance with sections 12 81-8,213 and 81-8,214 subsection (2) of section 81-8,300. If a claim is approved, compensation shall be paid to the claimants entitled to such 13 14 compensation in accordance with subsection (3) of section 81-8,211 15 81 - 8,300.

16 <u>(3) This section shall apply to any claim arising on or after</u> 17 <u>January 1, 2022.</u>
