Bill Summary:

LB 1014 would enable school districts to utilize School Psychologists for special education needs when such persons are employed through a service agency.

Section-by-Section Summary:

**SECTION 1** 

Section 38-3113 of the Psychology Practice Act is amended to clarify that it does not prevent certain activities, including teaching psychology, psychological research, or provision of services to organizations; allowing members of recognized professions, clergy, and certified school psychologists to practice within their scope; and permitting specified individuals, including graduate students, postdoctoral trainees, and those with a master's degree, to engage in psychology practice under the supervision of a licensed psychologist, subject to rules and regulations.
