Summary of purpose and/or changes:

This bill would create the Wildland Incident Response Assistance Team (WIRAT) in the office of the State Fire Marshal (SFM).



Section 1 of the bill contains the title of the act.

Section 2 of the bill creates the WIRAT program within the State Fire Marshal's office, states its mission, and provides for assistance to WIRAT from the Adjutant General and the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency.

Section 3 provides that the State Fire Marshal would serve as coordinator of WIRAT and assigns the SFM related duties.

Section 4 provides for squad leaders and related duties and powers for them.

Section 5 provides for the SFM to compensate squad leaders while serving in their WIRAT capacity.

Section 6 authorizes WIRAT to rent equipment needed for a wildland fire incident.

Section 7 provides permissive rulemaking authority to the SFM to carry out the provisions of the act.

This amendment adds reference to the title of the act in a statute setting out duties of the State Fire Marshal.
