Such additional distributions shall be paid from the Education Future Fund. A revised Net Option Funding formula is presented. Foundation Aid shall be \$1,500 per student with 23% of such aid paid from the Education Future Fund and shall count as a formula resource. Additional annual reporting requirements mandate school districts identify the amount of additional state aid as a result of legislation enacted in the most recently completed legislative session, and also the amount by which the school district reduced its property tax during such time, if any such reduction occurred.
