## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

This bill would change the processes involved in removing a signer's name from a petition.

This proposal would eliminate the requirement for a signed, sworn affidavit executed in the presence of an election commissioner, county clerk, or notary public. Instead, a signer would be able to remove his name by signing and delivering a written letter to the Secretary of State, election commissioner, or county clerk at any time up to the day that the petition is filed with the county for verification. A person who falsifies such a letter would be guilty of a Class IV felony.

AM 2558  The committee amendment would require election officials to verify the signature on the removal letter with the signature appearing in the voter registration records. This amendment would also clarify that the criminal penalty for falsifying a signature withdrawal letter is the same as the penalty for signing a petition when not legally qualified to do so.
