Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 913 requires DHHS to submit a state plan amendment for postpartum coverage to the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) for children covered under the unborn child option.

Sec. 1: On or before October 1, 2024, DHHS is required to seek approval for federal matching funds from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) through a state plan amendment to CHIP in order to implement a health services initiative to provide postpartum coverage for at least 6 months for a mother whose child is covered

under the unborn child option. The benefits provided during the postpartum period shall be identical to the comprehensive postpartum benefits provided to a pregnant woman under Medicaid. Nothing in this bill shall preclude DHHS from submitting a state plan amendment to provide 12 months of postpartum coverage.

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The Standing Committee Amendment, AM2321, provides the following changes:

AM2321 replaces the term "covered services" with "benefits" in Section 1. Also, new language is added that it is the intent of the Legislature to use the Medicaid Managed Care Excess Profit Fund to fund these services.
