FA206 changes the effective date of LB140 from January 1, 2024 to January 1, 2025.
LB140 provides for the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to issue Czech heritage plates. These plates will be available as both alphanumeric and personalized, with fees charged accordingly at both the initial application and renewal times. If ever the cost of manufacturing the plates exceeds the amount charged in fees, the revenue will first be credited to the Highway Trust Fund in the amount equal to the production cost overage. The remainder of the revenue, would then be distributed as normal to the DMV Cash Fund. Additionally, during the 2023 plate issuance cycle (the 6-year cycle started on January 1, 2023), if there are ever less than 500 Czech plates registered in any two consecutive years, the DMV shall cease to issue Czech plates at the next plate issuance cycle.

## Expenditures:

The DMV estimates there would be approximately 500 sets (or 1,000 plates) produced in the first year of issuance, at a cost of $\$ 4,100$ for FY2024-25 (1,000 $\times \$ 4.10$ ). With double that amount estimated for the second year of issuance, with an expense of $\$ 8,200$ for FY2025-26 (2,000 x \$4.10).

## Revenue:

The DMV estimates the plate registrations most likely would be $75 \%$ alphanumeric and $25 \%$ personalized message plates. This would equate to $\$ 6,875$ revenue for FY2024-25 and \$13,750 for FY2025-26.

There is no basis to disagree with this estimate of fiscal impact provided by the DMV.

Past history has shown that 1000 sets of these plates will be sold every fiscal year. We estimate 500 sets of plates will be sold during the first fiscal year. In addition, past history has shown that $75 \%$ of the plates sold are Numeric plates and $25 \%$ are Message plates.
