Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

AM 2978 supersedes the original bill, establishing a Veteran Justice Program in Nebraska, set to become operative on July 1, 2025.

Section 1 defines key definitions essential to the understanding and implementation of the amendment. Following, Section 2 inaugurates the Veteran Justice Program, to be administered by the probation administrator and adhering to the Supreme Court's guidelines. This program will be accessible across all district and county courts, operating under the premise of deferred judgments, with certain outlined exceptions.

Section 3 explains the criteria for eligibility and presumption of participation. The bill suggests that veterans, whose offenses may be linked to service-related conditions, are presumed eligible. This presumption stands unless a judicial determination is made, suggesting that the veteran's participation would not contribute to public safety.

Section 4, amends the Veteran Justice Program's core elements and judicial discretion. It emphasizes the provision of targeted, evidence-based treatments for conditions such as PTSD and traumatic brain injury, through tailored case plans crafted in collaboration between the judiciary and experts.

Section 5 mandates that courts allow defendants the opportunity to confidentially reveal their veteran status, which will be considered a mitigating factor during sentencing. It explicitly prohibits the use of veteran status as an aggravating factor, highlighting the importance of recognizing the relationship between military service and certain offenses as a basis for sentencing mitigation.

Section 6 obliges law enforcement and court personnel to verify the veteran status of individuals within the criminal justice system, alongside receiving specialized training on veterans' issues, including the impacts of military service and related traumas.

Finally, Section 7 assigns the State Court Administrator the responsibility of compiling and analyzing data regarding veterans' engagement with the program. This includes tracking participation rates, program outcomes, and demographic information, with a mandate to report findings to the Judiciary Committee, thereby ensuring transparency and the program's continuous improvement.

The Supreme Court has indicated that AM2978 may result in a General Fund fiscal impact estimated at \$4,548,575, beginning in FY25-26. This projection includes allocations for a specialist role in each judicial district dedicated to managing and coordinating veteran services, the addition of Veteran Treatment Court probation officers in districts boasting veteran problem-solving courts and significant veteran demographics, and the provision of administrative and IT support aimed at bolstering case management, veteran status verification, and data reporting enhancements. There is no basis to disagree with the estimates.

Counties could see a substantial fiscal impact for AM2978.
