Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 43. as amended (sections 1-5 of AM 2076), is the First Freedom Act.

Under the act state action shall not substantially burden a person's right to the exercise of religion unless it is essential to further a compelling governmental interest and is the least restrictive means of furthering that interest. Additionally, state action shall not restrict a religious organization from operating and engaging in religious services during a state of emergency to a greater extent than the state restricts other organizations or businesses from operating during a state of emergency.

Section 6 allows a person who is a member of an indigenous tribe and is a student attending an approved or accredited public school to wear tribal regalia in any public or private location where the person is otherwise authorized to be on school grounds or at any school function. Schools may adopt a policy to accommodate such students. Section 7 extends this protection to a student attending any Nebraska public postsecondary institution.

Section 8 changes the amount of time for which state agencies shall not charge residents of Nebraska for searching, identifying, physically redacting or copying public records. Currently, agencies shall not charge staff time for the first four hours. LB 43 changes that to eight hours. For non-Nebraska residents, such fees may include a charge for the proportion of existing salary or pay obligation to the public officers or employees.

Section 13 requires that a state statute or rule or regulation being interpreted by a hearing officer or judge hearing a contested case shall not defer to the agency's interpretation of such statute, rule or regulation.

Sections 17-20 of AM 2076 are the Personal Privacy Protection Act. Public entities are prohibited from

- Requiring any individual to provide personal information or otherwise compelling the release of personal information;
- Requiring any nonprofit organization to provide personal information or otherwise compelling the release of personal information;
- Publicizing or disclosing personal information without the express permission of every individual who is identifiable from the
  potential release; and
- Requesting or requiring a current or prospective contractor or grantee to provide a list of nonprofit organizations to which the contractor or grantee has provided financial or nonfinancial support.

The Department of Administrative Services estimates the need for 1.0 Attorney III position to address the provisions of LB 43. DAS points to the provisions in section 13 as the cause of this need. According to DAS, "This is anticipated to result in an increase in personnel complaints and appeals being filed." Changing the basis upon which cases are reviewed by hearing officers and/or judges should not impact the number of complaints and appeals. The estimate of needing additional staffing does not appear to be reasonable. For this reason, the DAS estimate is not included in the table above.

The University of Nebraska estimates the need for a part-time attorney position. This position will be used to address reviewing documents where "all meaningful information" is redacted prior to providing such documents. This estimate is based on the number of prior years requests and appears to be reasonable.

#### **Explanation of Estimate:**

LB 43 AM 2076 creates the First Freedom Act, which prohibits state action from substantially burdening a person's right to the exercise of religion. The bill provides remedies for violations of the provisions involving religious activity. The bill also has provisions regarding members of indigenous tribes wearing tribal regalia at schools and school function. These provisions have no fiscal impact to DAS.

LB 43 AM 2076 also proposes to allow a separate method of determining the actual added cost of making copies of public records available for nonresidents of Nebraska. The actual added cost used as the basis for the calculation of a fee for producing copies of public records for nonresidents of Nebraska may include a charge for existing salary or pay obligation to the public officers or employees, including a charge for the services of an attorney to review the requested public records.

For residents, which is defined by the bill as a person domiciled in Nebraska and includes news media without regard to domicile, the actual added cost shall include any charge for the first eight hours of searching, identifying, physically redacting, or copying, which is an increase from the current four hours. Any estimate is to be provided to the requester in writing and attested to under oath by the custodian of the public record(s). The bill provides the custodian the option to reduce or waive any fee. These provisions limit the amount of costs that can be recouped for providing such records.

Further, the bill as amended, proposes to permit the withholding of records relating to the nature, location, or function of cybersecurity by the State of Nebraska and requires the Nebraska information Technology Commission to adopt and promulgate rules and regulations. The promulgation of the rules and regulations will require time and resources.

Section 13 provides that any hearing officer or judge hearing a contested case shall not defer to an agency's interpretation of such statute or rule. This is anticipated to result in an increase in personnel complaints and appeals being filed. DAS would require at least one additional Attorney III to cover the increased personnel complaints and appeals. The estimated cost for this FTE is \$124,183 in FY24-25 and \$129,202 in FY25-26. These costs include salary and benefits (health insurance is budgeted using the State's current share of the highest cost family plan as a bases); and ongoing annual operating costs (communication/data processing, computer leasing, printing/publication, rent/depreciation surcharge, and supplies. There would also be a one-time cost of \$1500 for the FTE in FY24-25 for set-up costs and the cost of new non-capitalized equipment (monitor, furniture, etc.).

These additional costs would result in the need for additional revolving fund appropriation and an increase in the DAS Director's Office - Central Legal assessment in FY24-25 and beyond.

Any increase in a DAS internal assessment can impact the enterprise due to possible increases in rates charged to other agencies for DAS goods and services.

Section 14 provides that any court reviewing an appeal of a contested case shall interpret the statute or rule de novo. Similarly, in actions brought against the State, after applying all customary tools of interpretation of a statute or rule, the court or hearing officer shall resolve any remaining doubt in favor of a reasonable interpretation which limits agency power and maximizes individual liberty. This could result in increased tort claims against the state. However, the frequency or the dollar value of such claims is indeterminable.

Section 15 of the bill, as amended, prohibits state agencies from imposing annual filing and reporting requirements on charitable organizations. The Department of Administrative Services does not have any involvement in annual filing or reporting requirements. This section has no fiscal impact.

Sections 17-20 of the bill as amended prohibits agencies from requiring any individual or nonprofit organization to provide personal information or otherwise release personal information as well as requesting or requiring a current or prospective contractor or grantee to provide a list of nonprofit organizations to which they have provided financial or nonfinancial support. This section has no fiscal impact.

The bill creates a number of potential fiscal impacts. Except for the additional costs associated with the additional Attorney III outlined, above, the exact total fiscal impact is unknown.

#### **Explanation of Estimate:**

Personal Services:

LB43 AM207 incorporates provisions of three legislative bills that we have previously been requested to submit a fiscal note for: LB 277, LB 297, and LB 366.

The addition of the provisions of the First Freedom Act (LB 277) will have no fiscal impact on the University of Nebraska System.

The Privacy Protection Act (LB 297) would have an undetermined fiscal impact associated with: (1) review of current data sharing agreements to confirm compliance; (2) education and training of any staff who make public information disclosures; and (3) any added litigation expense in the event a disclosure of this type of information is requested.

With the addition of provisions of LB 366, the University of Nebraska System estimates increasing to 8 hours, from 4 hours, of free response time for public records requests for residents and news media will result in an average of \$200 in additional unrecoverable costs for University and IT staff time per request. Using the number of requests in FY 21-22 as a benchmark, we estimate this increase would impact approximately 100 records requests per year. Therefore, this additional free response time would result in approximately \$20,000 of additional unrecoverable staff time per year.

Based on the proposed language that prohibits the collection of fees for records where "all meaningful information" is redacted, and the requirement that the records director attest to any estimate under oath, additional attorney time will be needed upfront to review documents before providing any estimate. Using a total of \$44,000 (0.4 FTE for a new attorney), multiplied by the 30% benefits rate, we estimate a total \$57,200 in additional annual costs.

These estimates do not consider any increases in the number of public records requests submitted due to the expanded "free" response time, which we anticipate will occur.

**Explanation of Estimate:** 

LB43 requires Hearing Officers and Judges to interpret statutes and regulations to limit agency power and maximize individual liberty. This will require additional research and analysis for Attorney III positions in the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) Hearing Office.

AM2076 introduces the First Freedom Act, which disallows any agency from burdening a person's or organization's right of religion, and the Personal Privacy Protection Act, which disallows any agency from requiring individuals to provide personal information that is not already required by law. Violations of these Acts can result in civil action by the victim.

For residents of Nebraska, the fee for records shall not include any charge for the first eight hours of searching, identifying, physically redacting, or copying. A special service charge may be included in the fee for time required in excess of eight four cumulative hours. For non-residents, the fee for records may include a service charge for public officers or employees, including a proportional charge for the services of an attorney to review the requested public records, and for the time spent searching, identifying, physically redacting, copying, or reviewing such records. This may generate revenue to DHHS if these charges are implemented.

In actions brought by or against State agencies, after applying all customary tools of interpretation of a statute, rule, or regulation, the court or hearing officer shall resolve any remaining doubt in favor of a reasonable interpretation which limits agency power and maximizes individual liberty. If DHHS were to be involved in any dispute, this could cause legal costs to the agency.
