- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to amend section 79-1601,
 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 79-1605, Revised
 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2022; to change provisions relating
 to schools that elect not to meet accreditation or approval
- 5 requirements; to define a term; to harmonize provisions; and to
- 6 repeal the original sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 79-1601, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

79-1601 (1) Except as provided in subsections (2) through (6) of 3 this section, all private, denominational, and parochial schools in the 4 5 State of Nebraska and all teachers employed or giving instruction in such schools shall be subject to and governed by the provisions of the general 6 7 school laws of the state so far as the same apply to grades, qualifications, and certification of teachers and promotion of students. 8 9 All private, denominational, and parochial schools shall have adequate 10 equipment and supplies, shall be graded the same, and shall have courses of study for each grade conducted in such schools substantially the same 11 as those given in the public schools which the students would attend in 12 the absence of such private, denominational, or parochial schools. 13

(2) All private, denominational, or parochial schools shall either 14 comply with the accreditation or approval requirements as prescribed 15 pursuant to in section 79-318 or, for those schools which elect not to 16 17 meet accreditation or approval requirements, the requirements prescribed in section 79-318 and subsections (2) through (6) of this section. 18 Standards and procedures for approval and accreditation shall be based 19 upon the program of studies, guidance services, the number and 20 preparation of teachers in relation to the curriculum and enrollment, 21 instructional materials and equipment, science facilities and equipment, 22 library facilities and materials, and health and safety factors in 23 24 buildings and grounds. Rules and regulations governing which govern 25 standards and procedures for private, denominational, and parochial schools which elect, pursuant to the procedures prescribed in subsections 26 (2) through (6) of this section, not to meet state accreditation or 27 28 approval requirements shall be based upon an assurance evidence that such schools offer a program of instruction leading to the acquisition of 29 basic skills in the language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, 30 and health. The assurance required pursuant to this subsection shall be 31

satisfied by a signed statement by the parent, legal guardian, or 1 2 educational decisionmaker of a student that the education provided complies with subsections (2) through (6) of this section. Rules and 3 4 regulations which govern procedures under this section are limited to 5 procedures for receiving information from a parent, legal guardian, or educational decisionmaker of a student or a parent representative when 6 7 such individual files the election not to meet accreditation or approval requirements under this section. Such rules and regulations may include a 8 9 provision for the visitation of such schools and regular achievement 10 testing of students attending such schools in order to insure that such schools are offering instruction in the basic skills listed in this 11 12 subsection. Any arrangements for visitation or testing shall be made 13 through a parent representative of each such school. The results of such 14 testing may be used as evidence that such schools are offering 15 instruction in such basic skills but shall not be used to measure, compare, or evaluate the competency of students at such schools. 16 17

(3) The provisions of subsections (3) through (6) of this section shall apply to any private, denominational, or parochial school in the 18 19 State of Nebraska which elects not to meet state accreditation or approval requirements. An election Elections pursuant to such subsections 20 shall be effective when a statement is received by the Commissioner of 21 22 Education signed by a parent, legal guardian, or educational decisionmaker the parents or legal guardians of each student all students 23 attending such private, denominational, or parochial school, stating that 24 25 (a) either specifically (i) the requirements for approval and accreditation required by law and the rules and regulations adopted and 26 promulgated by the State Board of Education violate sincerely held 27 28 religious beliefs of the parent, parents or legal guardian, or educational decisionmaker guardians or (ii) the requirements for approval 29 and accreditation required by law and the rules and regulations adopted 30 and promulgated by the State Board of Education interfere with the 31

decisions of the <u>parent</u>, <u>parents or</u> legal <u>quardian</u>, <u>or educational</u> 1 2 decisionmaker quardians in directing the student's education, (b) an authorized representative of such parent, parents or legal guardian, or 3 4 educational decisionmaker guardians will at least annually submit to the 5 Commissioner of Education an assurance the information necessary to prove that the requirements of subdivisions (4)(a) through (c) of this section 6 7 are and will continue to be satisfied, (c) the school offers the courses of instruction required by subsections (2), (3), and (4) of this section, 8 9 (d) the parent, parents or legal guardian, or educational and 10 decisionmaker is guardians have satisfied themselves that individuals monitoring instruction at such school are qualified to 11 monitor 12 instruction in the basic skills as required by subsections (2), (3), and (4) of this section—and that such individuals have demonstrated an 13 alternative competency to monitor instruction or supervise students 14 15 pursuant to subsections (3) through (6) of this section.

(4) Each such private, denominational, or parochial school shall (a) 16 17 meet minimum requirements relating to health, fire, and safety standards prescribed by state law and the rules and regulations of the State Fire 18 19 Marshal, (b) report attendance pursuant to section 79-201, (c) maintain a sequential program of instruction designed to lead to basic skills in the 20 language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, and health, and (d) 21 comply with the immunization requirements in section 79-217 if the 22 statement signed by the parent, parents or legal guardian, or educational 23 24 decisionmaker indicates guardians indicate a nonreligious reason pursuant 25 to subdivision (3)(a)(ii) of this section for the student attending a private, denominational, or parochial school which elects not to meet 26 27 state accreditation or approval requirements. The State Board Education shall establish procedures for receiving information and 28 reports required by subsections (3) through (6) of this section from 29 30 authorized parent representatives who may act as agents for the parent, parents or legal guardian, or educational decisionmaker guardians of a 31

- (5) Individuals employed or utilized by schools which elect not to 4 5 meet state accreditation or approval requirements shall not be required 6 to meet the certification requirements prescribed in sections 79-801 to 7 79-815. but shall either (a) take appropriate subject matter components of a nationally recognized teacher competency examination designated by 8 9 the State Board of Education as (i) including the appropriate subject 10 matter areas for purposes of satisfying the requirements of subsections (3) and (4) of this section and (ii) a nationally recognized examination 11 12 or (b) offer evidence of competence to provide instruction in the basic skills required by subsections (3) and (4) of this section pursuant to 13 informal methods of evaluation which shall be developed by the State 14 15 Board of Education. Such evidence may include educational transcripts, diplomas, and other information regarding the formal educational 16 17 background of such individuals. Information concerning test results, 18 transcripts, diplomas, and other evidence of formal education may be 19 transmitted to the State Department of Education by authorized 20 representatives of parents or legal guardians. The results of such 21 testing or alternative evaluation of individuals who monitor the 22 instruction of students attending such schools may be used as evidence of whether or not such schools are offering adequate instruction in the 23 24 basic skills prescribed in subsections (2), (3), and (4) of this section 25 but shall not be used to prohibit any such school from employing such individuals. Failure of a monitor, who is tested for the purpose of 26 27 satisfying in whole or in part the requirements of subsections (3) 28 through (6) of this section, to attain a score equal to or exceeding both 29 the state or national average score or rating on appropriate subject 30 matter components of recognized teacher competency examinations designated by the State Board of Education may be by itself sufficient 31

- 1 proof that such school does not offer adequate instruction in the basic
- 2 skills prescribed in subsections (3) and (4) of this section.
- 3 (6) The demonstration of competency to monitor instruction in a
- 4 private, denominational, or parochial school which has elected not to
- 5 meet state accreditation or approval requirements shall in no way
- 6 constitute or be construed to grant a license, permit, or certificate to
- 7 teach in the State of Nebraska. Any school which elects not to meet state
- 8 accreditation or approval requirements and does not meet the requirements
- 9 of subsections (2) through (6) of this section shall not be deemed a
- 10 school—for purposes of section 79-201, and the parent, parents or legal
- 11 <u>guardian</u>, <u>or educational decisionmaker</u> <u>guardians</u> of any students
- 12 attending such school shall be subject to prosecution pursuant to such
- 13 section <u>79-201</u> or any statutes relating to habitual truancy.
- 14 (7) For purposes of this section, educational decisionmaker means a
- 15 person designated or ordered by a court to make educational decisions on
- 16 behalf of a child.
- 17 Sec. 2. Section 79-1605, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 18 2022, is amended to read:
- 19 79-1605 (1) The superintendent of the school district in which any
- 20 private, denominational, or parochial school is located, which school is
- 21 not otherwise inspected by an area or diocesan representative holding a
- 22 Nebraska certificate to administer, shall inspect such schools and report
- 23 to the proper officers any evidence of failure to observe any of the
- 24 provisions of sections 79-1601 to 79-1607. The Commissioner of Education,
- 25 when in his or her judgment it is deemed advisable, may appoint a public
- 26 school official other than such superintendent, including a member of the
- 27 State Department of Education, for such inspections. Such appointee shall
- 28 hold a Nebraska certificate to administer. The State Board of Education
- 29 shall require the superintendents and appointed public school officials
- 30 to make such inspections at least twice a year, and the school officers
- 31 of such schools and the teachers giving instruction in such schools shall

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1 permit such inspection and assist and cooperate in the making of the

- 2 same.
- 3 (2) This section does not apply to (a) any private, denominational,
- 4 <u>or parochial school which elects not to meet accreditation or approval</u>
- 5 requirements pursuant to the procedures prescribed in subsections (2)
- 6 through (6) of section 79-1601 or (b) a school inspected by an area or
- 7 diocesan representative holding a Nebraska certificate to administer.
