6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 43-2,119, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2022, is amended to read:

3 43-2,119 (1) The number of judges of the separate juvenile court in
4 counties which have established a separate juvenile court shall be:

5 (a) Two judges in counties having seventy-five thousand inhabitants
6 but less than three two hundred thousand inhabitants;

7 (b) Four judges in counties having at least <u>three</u> two hundred 8 thousand inhabitants but less than <u>five</u> four hundred thousand 9 inhabitants; and

10 (c) Six judges in counties having <u>five</u> four hundred thousand 11 inhabitants or more.

12 (2) The senior judge in point of service as a juvenile court judge 13 shall be the presiding judge. The judges shall rotate the office of 14 presiding judge every three years unless the judges agree to another 15 system.
