- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to create the School Construction
- 2 Assistance Task Force; to provide powers and duties; and to declare
- 3 an emergency.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. <u>(1) The School Construction Assistance Task Force is</u>
2	created. The task force shall study issues and develop recommendations
3	relating to school construction assistance.
4	<u>(2)(a) The task force shall consist of the following members, who</u>
5	shall be appointed no later than August 1, 2024:
6	<u>(i) A member of the Education Committee of the Legislature appointed</u>
7	by the Executive Board of the Legislative Council;
8	<u>(ii) A member of the Appropriations Committee of the Legislature</u>
9	appointed by the Executive Board of the Legislative Council;
10	<u>(iii) A member of the Revenue Committee of the Legislature appointed</u>
11	by the Executive Board of the Legislative Council;
12	<u>(iv) A representative of the Governor's office appointed by the</u>
13	<u>Governor;</u>
14	<u>(v) A superintendent of a school district with ten thousand or more</u>
15	students appointed by the Commissioner of Education;
16	<u>(vi) A superintendent of a school district with more than one</u>
17	thousand students and fewer than ten thousand students appointed by the
18	<u>Commissioner of Education;</u>
19	<u>(vii) Two superintendents of school districts with one thousand or</u>
20	fewer students appointed by the Commissioner of Education;
21	<u>(viii) A representative of the capital construction industry</u>
22	appointed by the Commissioner of Education; and
23	<u>(ix) A representative of the statewide chamber of commerce appointed</u>
24	by the Governor.
25	<u>(b) To the extent practicable, the members shall represent a</u>
26	geographic diversity across the state.
27	(3) The task force shall elect a chairperson from among the members.
28	The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of
29	<u>the chairperson or a majority of the members of the task force. A</u>
30	majority of the members of the task force shall constitute a quorum for
31	the transaction of business. Official action by the task force requires

1	the approval of a majority of the members of the task force.
2	<u>(4) On or before September 1, 2025, the task force shall</u>
3	electronically submit a report of recommendations relating to school
4	construction assistance to the Education Committee of the Legislature,
5	the Appropriations Committee of the Legislature, and the Revenue
6	Committee of the Legislature. Administrative and support staff for the
7	task force shall be provided by the staff of the Education Committee of
8	the Legislature, Revenue Committee of the Legislature, and Appropriations
9	Committee of the Legislature as directed by the chairpersons of such
10	committees. Such report shall include, but need not be limited to:
11	<u>(a) How the state can support school construction project costs</u>
12	while maintaining and protecting local control;
13	<u>(b) Different funding sources available from the state to use for</u>
14	school construction project financing;
15	<u>(c) The feasibility of debt pooling to reduce interest rates</u>
16	relating to school construction projects;
17	<u>(d) The feasibility of partnering with local political subdivisions</u>
18	to reduce school construction project costs;
19	<u>(e) How to streamline the process of school construction projects;</u>
20	and
21	<u>(f) The appropriate role of the State Department of Education in</u>
22	supporting capital infrastructure systems and providing technical
23	<u>assistance.</u>
24	Sec. 2. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
25	passed and approved according to law.
