- 10 lessee shall have the credit provided for in this section applied toward
- 11 payment of the motor vehicle fees and taxes then owing. Otherwise, the

When no such 30 replacement motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer is so registered, the 31

- 2 credit for the registration fee and the motor vehicle tax and fee and
- 3 issue a credit certificate to the owner. When such motor vehicle,
