- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to adopt the Special Educators
- 2 of Tomorrow Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Sections 1 to 7 of this act shall be known and may be Section 1.

- 2 cited as the Special Educators of Tomorrow Act.
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Special Educators of Tomorrow Act:
- (1) Commission means the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary 4
- 5 Education;
- (2) Direct support professional means any individual who is employed 6
- 7 in this state and provides direct care support or any other form of
- treatment, services, or care for individuals with intellectual and 8
- 9 developmental disabilities;
- 10 (3) Eligible institution means a not-for-profit college or
- university which (a) is located in Nebraska, (b) is accredited by an 11
- accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of 12
- Education as determined to be acceptable by the State Board of Education, 13
- and (c) has a teacher education program and special education program; 14
- (4) Eligible student means an individual who meets the requirements 15
- for a scholarship under the Special Educators of Tomorrow Act pursuant to 16
- 17 subsection (1) of section 3 of this act or a loan pursuant to subsection
- 18 (2) of section 3 of this act;
- (5) Loan recipient means an eligible student receiving a loan under 19
- the Special Educators of Tomorrow Act; and 20
- (6) Scholarship recipient means an eligible student receiving a 21
- 22 scholarship under the Special Educators of Tomorrow Act.
- (1) An individual is eligible for a scholarship under the 23
- Special Educators of Tomorrow Act if such individual: 24
- 25 (a) At the time of application, has at least two years of experience
- as a direct support professional; and 26
- (b) Is enrolled or plans to enroll at an eligible institution to 27
- pursue a teaching career in special education. 28
- (2) An individual is eligible for a loan under the Special Educators 29
- of Tomorrow Act if such individual: 30
- (a) At the time of application, has at least two years of experience 31

- 1 as a direct support professional;
- 2 (b) Agrees to complete a special education program at an eligible
- 3 institution and has declared a special education major; and
- 4 (c) Commits to teach in an accredited or approved public or private
- 5 school in Nebraska upon (i) successful completion of the special
- 6 education program and (ii) becoming certified pursuant to section 79-806
- 7 <u>to 79-815.</u>
- 8 Sec. 4. (1) Beginning in the 2024-25 school year through the
- 9 2029-30 school year, an eligible student that meets the requirements of
- 10 subsection (1) of section 3 of this act may apply to the commission on
- 11 forms and in a manner prescribed by the commission on an annual basis for
- 12 <u>not to exceed two years for a scholarship of up to two thousand five</u>
- 13 <u>hundred dollars per school year for educational expenses. A scholarship</u>
- 14 recipient shall be in good academic standing with the recipient's
- 15 <u>eligible institution to be eligible to reapply for a scholarship.</u>
- 16 Scholarships shall be funded pursuant to section 6 of this act.
- 17 (2) Beginning in the 2024-25 school year through the 2029-30 school
- 18 year, an eligible student that meets the requirements of subsection (2)
- 19 of section 3 of this act may apply to the commission on forms and in a
- 20 manner prescribed by the commission on an annual basis for a loan in an
- 21 amount not to exceed four thousand dollars per school year. Loans awarded
- 22 to individual students shall not exceed a cumulative period exceeding
- 23 three consecutive years. Loans shall be funded pursuant to section 6 of
- 24 this act.
- 25 Sec. 5. (1) Prior to receiving any money from a loan pursuant to
- 26 the Special Educators of Tomorrow Act, an eligible student shall enter
- 27 <u>into a contract with the commission. Such contract shall be exempt from</u>
- 28 the requirements of sections 73-501 to 73-510.
- 29 (2) The contract shall require that if (a) the loan recipient is not
- 30 employed as a full-time teacher teaching in an approved or accredited
- 31 school in Nebraska and teaching at least a portion of the time in special

- 1 education for a time period equal to the number of years required for
- 2 <u>loan forgiveness pursuant to subsection (3) of this section or (b) the</u>
- 3 loan recipient does not complete the requirements for graduation within
- 4 three consecutive years after receiving the initial loan under the
- 5 program, then the loan shall be repaid with interest at the rate fixed
- 6 pursuant to section 45-103 accruing as of the date the loan recipient
- 7 signed the contract and actual collection costs as determined by the
- 8 commission. If a loan recipient fails to remain enrolled at an eligible
- 9 institution or otherwise fails to continue to be an eligible student,
- 10 repayment of the loan shall commence within six months after such change
- 11 <u>in eligibility. The commission may by rule and regulation provide for</u>
- 12 <u>exceptions to the conditions of repayment pursuant to this subsection</u>
- 13 <u>based upon mitigating circumstances.</u>
- 14 (3)(a) If the loan recipient (i) successfully completes the special
- 15 <u>education program for which the loan recipient is receiving a forgivable</u>
- 16 loan pursuant to the act and becomes certified pursuant to sections
- 17 79-806 to 79-815 with an endorsement in special education, (ii) becomes
- 18 employed as a full-time teacher teaching at least a portion of the time
- 19 in special education in an approved or accredited school in this state
- 20 within six months after becoming certified, and (iii) otherwise meets the
- 21 requirements of the contract, payments shall be suspended for the number
- 22 of years that the borrower is required to remain employed as a teacher in
- 23 this state under the contract.
- 24 (b) Beginning after the first two years of teaching full-time in
- 25 Nebraska following graduation with the degree for which the loan was
- 26 received, for each year that the loan recipient teaches full-time in
- 27 <u>Nebraska pursuant to the contract, the loan shall be forgiven in an</u>
- 28 amount equal to four thousand dollars.
- 29 Sec. 6. <u>(1) The Special Educators of Tomorrow Cash Fund is created.</u>
- 30 The fund shall consist of transfers by the Legislature and loan
- 31 repayments, penalties, and interest payments received in the course of

- 1 administering the Special Educators of Tomorrow Act. The fund shall be
- 2 <u>used to fund scholarships and loans to students pursuant to the Special</u>
- 3 Educators of Tomorrow Act. Any money in the Special Educators of Tomorrow
- 4 Cash Fund available for investment shall be invested by the state
- 5 <u>investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the</u>
- 6 Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
- 7 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature to transfer one million five
- 8 hundred thousand dollars from the General Fund to the Special Educators
- 9 of Tomorrow Fund for fiscal year 2024-25 and two hundred fifty thousand
- 10 dollars for each fiscal year thereafter.
- 11 Sec. 7. (1) The commission may adopt and promulgate rules and
- 12 regulations to carry out the Special Educators of Tomorrow Act.
- 13 (2) The Division of Developmental Disabilities of the Department of
- 14 Health and Human Services shall provide information to direct support
- 15 professionals relating to scholarships and loans available pursuant to
- 16 the Special Educators of Tomorrow Act.
