LEGISLATIVE BILL 854

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to certified public accountants; to amend
2	sections 1-116, 1-124, 1-136, and 1-136.02, Reissue Revised Statutes
3	of Nebraska; to change the examination eligibility, certification,
4	and permitting requirements relating to certified public
5	accountants; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original
6	sections.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 1-116, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

(1)(a) Prior to January 1, 2025, any Any person making 3 1 - 116initial application to take the examination described in section 1-114 is 4 5 shall be eligible to take the examination if he or she has completed at least one hundred fifty semester hours or two hundred twenty-five quarter 6 7 hours of postsecondary academic credit and has earned a baccalaureate or 8 higher degree from a college or university accredited by an accrediting 9 agency recognized by the United States Department of Education or a similar agency as determined to be acceptable by the board. The person 10 shall demonstrate that accounting, auditing, business, and other subjects 11 at the appropriate academic level as required by the board are included 12 13 within the required hours of postsecondary academic credit.

14 (b) Prior to January 1, 2025, a A person who expects to complete the postsecondary academic credit and earn the degree as required by this 15 16 subsection section may take test sections of the examination within one 17 hundred twenty days prior to completing the postsecondary academic credit and earning the degree, but such person shall not receive any credit for 18 19 such test sections unless evidence satisfactory to the board showing that such person has completed the postsecondary academic credit and earned 20 the degree as required by this subsection section is received by the 21 board within one hundred fifty days following when the first test section 22 23 of the examination is taken.

(2)(a) On or after January 1, 2025, any person making initial 24 application to take the examination described in section 1-114 is 25 eligible to take the examination if he or she has completed at least one 26 hundred twenty semester hours or one hundred eighty quarter hours of 27 postsecondary academic credit and has earned a baccalaureate or higher 28 degree from a college or university accredited by an accrediting agency 29 recognized by the United States Department of Education or a similar 30 31 agency as determined to be acceptable by the board. The person shall

2 <u>the appropriate academic level as required by the board are included</u>

3 within the required hours of postsecondary academic credit.

(b) On or after January 1, 2025, no person is allowed to take any
portion of the examination prior to completing the academic credit and
earning the degree required by this subsection.

7 (3) The board shall not prescribe the specific curricula of colleges
8 or universities.

9 <u>(4)</u> If the applicant is an individual, the application shall include 10 the applicant's social security number.

11 Sec. 2. Section 1-124, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 12 amended to read:

1-124 (1)(a) The board may, in its discretion, waive the examination 13 described in section 1-114 and may issue a reciprocal certificate as a 14 public 15 certified accountant to any person who possesses the qualifications specified in subdivision (2)(a) of section 1-114 and 16 section 1-116 and who is the holder of a certificate as a certified 17 public accountant, then in full force and effect, issued under the laws 18 19 of any state or is the holder of a certificate, license, or degree in a foreign country constituting a recognized gualification for the practice 20 of public accountancy in such country, comparable to that of a certified 21 22 public accountant of this state, which is then in full force and effect.

(b) The board shall waive the examination described in section 1-114 23 24 and the educational requirements specified in section 1-116 and shall 25 issue a reciprocal certificate as a certified public accountant to any person who possesses the qualifications specified in subdivision (2)(a) 26 of section 1-114, who is the holder of a certificate as a certified 27 public accountant, then in full force and effect, issued under the laws 28 of any state, who meets all other current requirements of the board for 29 issuance of a certificate as a certified public accountant, and who, at 30 the time of the application for a reciprocal certificate as a certified 31

public accountant, has had, within the ten years immediately preceding application, at least four <u>years of years'</u> experience in the practice of public accountancy specified in <u>subdivision (1)(b)</u> subsection (1) of section 1-136.02.

5 (2) The board shall charge each person obtaining a reciprocal 6 certificate issued under this section a fee as established by the board 7 not to exceed four hundred dollars.

8 Sec. 3. Section 1-136, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 9 amended to read:

10 1-136 (1) Permits to engage in the practice of public accountancy in this state shall be issued by the board to (a) persons who are holders of 11 the certificate of certified public accountant issued under sections 12 1-114 to 1-124 and who have met the <u>education and</u> experience requirements 13 of section 1-136.02, (b) partnerships and limited liability companies of 14 certified public accountants registered under section 1-126, and (c) 15 corporations registered under section 1-134 as long as all offices of 16 17 such certificate holders or registrants in this state for the practice of public accountancy are maintained and registered as required under 18 19 section 1-135.

(2)(a) Except as provided in the case of permits subject to 20 subdivision (2)(b) of this section, the board shall charge an annual 21 permit fee as established by the board not to exceed one hundred fifty 22 dollars. All permits subject to this subdivision shall expire on June 30 23 24 of each year and may be renewed annually for a period of one year by certificate holders and registrants in good standing upon payment of an 25 annual renewal fee as established by the board not to exceed one hundred 26 fifty dollars. The board may prorate the fee for any permit subject to 27 this subdivision issued for less than one year. 28

(b) The board shall charge a biennial permit fee as established by
the board not to exceed three hundred dollars for permits issued under
subdivision (1)(a) of this section. All permits subject to this

subdivision shall expire on June 30 of the first calendar year after the 1 2 calendar year of issuance in which the age of the certificate holder or the registrant becomes divisible by two, and may be renewed biennially 3 4 for a period of two years by certificate holders and registrants in good standing upon payment of a biennial renewal fee as established by the 5 board not to exceed three hundred dollars. The board may prorate the fee 6 for any permit subject to this subdivision issued for less than two 7 years. 8

9 (3) Failure of a certificate holder or registrant to apply for a permit within (a) three years from the expiration date of the permit last 10 obtained or renewed or (b) three years from the date upon which the 11 certificate holder or registrant was issued a certificate or registration 12 if no permit was ever issued to such person shall deprive him or her of 13 the right to issuance or renewal of a permit unless the board, in its 14 discretion, determines such failure to have been excusable. In such case 15 16 the renewal fee or the fee for the issuance of the original permit, as the case may be, shall be such amount as established by the board not to 17 exceed three hundred dollars. 18

19 (4) Any certificate holder or registrant who has not lost his or her right to issuance or renewal of a permit and who is not actively engaged 20 in the practice of public accountancy in this state may file a written 21 application with the board to be classified as inactive. A person so 22 23 classified shall not be issued a permit or be deemed the holder of a 24 permit but shall be carried upon an inactive roll to be maintained by the board upon the payment of an inactive fee as established by the board not 25 to exceed fifty percent of the fee charged persons actively engaged in 26 the practice of public accountancy as provided in this section. A person 27 28 so classified shall not be deprived of the right to the issuance or renewal of a permit and may, upon application to the board and upon 29 payment of the current permit fee, be issued a current permit. 30

1-136.02 (1) The board shall issue a permit under subdivision (1)(a)
of section 1-136 to a holder of a certificate as a certified public
accountant when such holder has <u>completed</u> had:

5 (a) At least one hundred fifty semester hours or two hundred twentyfive quarter hours of postsecondary academic credit and has earned a 6 7 baccalaureate or higher degree from a college or university accredited by a regional accrediting agency as recognized by the United States 8 <u>Department of Education or a similar agency as determined</u> to be 9 10 acceptable by the board. The person shall demonstrate that accounting, auditing, business, and other subjects at the appropriate academic level 11 as required by the board are included within the required hours of 12 13 postsecondary academic credit; and

(b)(i) (a) Two years of accounting experience satisfactory to the 14 board, in any state or foreign country, in employment as an accountant in 15 a firm, proprietorship, partnership, corporation, limited liability 16 17 company, or other business entity authorized in any state to engage in the practice of public accountancy under the supervision of an active 18 certified public accountant who is the holder of a permit issued under 19 subdivision (1)(a) of section 1-136 or the equivalent issued by another 20 21 state;

22 (ii) (b) Except as provided in subdivision (b)(iii) (c) of this subsection, three years of accounting experience satisfactory to the 23 24 board, in any state or foreign country, in employment as (A) (i) an 25 accountant in government or business under the supervision of an active certified public accountant who is the holder of a permit issued under 26 subdivision (1)(a) of section 1-136 or the equivalent issued by another 27 28 state or (B) (ii) faculty at a college or university of recognized standing under the supervision of an active certified public accountant 29 who is the holder of a permit issued under subdivision (1)(a) of section 30 1-136 or the equivalent issued by another state; or 31

1 <u>(iii)</u> (c) Two years of accounting experience satisfactory to the 2 board in employment as an accountant in the office of the Auditor of 3 Public Accounts or the Department of Revenue under the supervision of an 4 active certified public accountant who is the holder of a permit issued 5 under subdivision (1)(a) of section 1-136 or the equivalent issued by 6 another state.

7 (2) The board shall issue a permit under subdivision (1)(a) of
8 section 1-136 to a holder of a reciprocal certificate issued under
9 section 1-124 upon a showing that:

10 (a) He or she meets all current requirements in this state for11 issuance of a permit at the time the application is made; and

12 (b) At the time of the application for a permit the applicant, 13 within the ten years immediately preceding application, meets <u>an</u> the 14 experience requirement in subdivision (1)(b) (1)(a), (b), or (c) of this 15 section.
