THE MEMBERS OF THE ONE HUNDRED EIGHTH LEGISLATURE OF NEBRASKA,
SECOND SESSION, RESOLVE THAT:

3 Section 1. At the general election in November 2024 the following 4 proposed amendment to the Constitution of Nebraska shall be submitted to 5 the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval or rejection:

6 To amend Article III, sections 6 and 10:

7 III-6 The Legislature shall consist of not more than fifty members 8 and not less than thirty members. The regular sessions of the Legislature 9 shall be biennial annual except as otherwise provided by this constitution or as may be otherwise provided by law. 10

III-10 (1) Beginning with the year 2027 1975, regular sessions of 11 the Legislature shall be held biennially in odd-numbered years annually, 12 commencing at 10 a.m. on the first Wednesday after the first Monday in 13 January of each year. The duration of regular sessions held shall not 14 exceed ninety legislative days in odd-numbered years unless extended by a 15 16 vote of four-fifths of all members of elected to the Legislature. Until 2027, regular sessions of the Legislature shall be held annually, 17 commencing at 10 a.m. on the first Wednesday after the first Monday in 18 19 January of each year. The duration of regular sessions held shall not exceed ninety legislative days in odd-numbered years unless extended by a 20 vote of four-fifths of all members elected to the Legislature, and shall 21 22 not exceed sixty legislative days in even-numbered years unless extended

by a vote of four-fifths of all members elected to the Legislature. Bills and resolutions under consideration by the Legislature upon adjournment of a regular session held in an odd-numbered year may be considered at the next regular session, as if there had been no such adjournment.

5 (2) The Lieutenant Governor shall preside, but shall vote only when the Legislature is equally divided. A majority of the members of elected 6 to the Legislature shall constitute a quorum. The ; the Legislature shall 7 determine the rules of its proceedings, and be the judge of the election, 8 9 returns, and qualifications of its members, and shall choose its own 10 officers, including a Speaker to preside when the Lieutenant Governor is shall be absent, incapacitated, or <u>acting</u> shall act as Governor. No 11 member shall be expelled except by a vote of two-thirds of all members of 12 elected to the Legislature, and no member shall be twice expelled for the 13 same offense. The Legislature may punish by imprisonment any person who 14 is not a member of the Legislature thereof who is shall be guilty of 15 16 disrespect to the Legislature by disorderly or contemptuous behavior in its presence, but no such imprisonment shall extend beyond twenty-four 17 hours at one time, unless the person persists shall persist in such 18 19 disorderly or contemptuous behavior.

20 Sec. 2. The proposed amendment shall be submitted to the electors 21 in the manner prescribed by the Constitution of Nebraska, Article XVI, 22 section 1, with the following ballot language:

A constitutional amendment to provide for regular sessions of the Legislature to occur only biennially in odd-numbered years beginning in 25 2027.
